Cities Receiving Highway Funds From The State

Distribution of two state funds to Oregon cities and counties was announced today by Secretary of State Robert S. Farrell, whose office distributes the funds. Counties receive \$800,000 as the first payment on their share of the 1945 state highway fund, the second payment to be made in December. The December payment will total \$1,200,000.

Counties and cities received a total of \$55,485.79 as their share of the quarterly distribution of state liquor tax funds, and these funds are apportioned on a population basis.

Traffic fatalities in the state of Oregon during the month of June set an all-time low for the period that accident statistics have been maintained in this state, reports Robert S. Farrell, Secretary of State. There were 12 persons killed in traffic in Oregon in June, the lowest toll for that month since records were started in 1933. In that year, 16 fatalities were reported in June.

The June toll this year was 40 per cent under the fatality toll of June of 1944 when 20 persons were killed, Farrell said.

There were seven pedestrian deaths in June, 58 per cent of the fatality toll. Besides the seven pedestrians killed, there was one bicyclist death, one death involving the collision of two cars and three deaths from non-collision accidents. Of the twelve deaths, two occurred in the city of Portland, one in the city of Weston and the remainder were in rural areas.
