On Saturday, March 9, Upper Two Mile district will vote on the sale of the school site, buildings, and equipment in said district.

This school is one of the 22 districts which have suspended and are sending their pupils out for education. It appears to some of the voters in Upper Two Mile that the building, which has been unused for several years, is deteriorating and during this shortage in housing a buyer could be obtained.

The law requires that in a third class district the board must be authorized by a vote of the people before school properties can be sold. The money from the sale of such

buildings goes into the general fund of the district making the sale.

For many years the Upper Two

Mile district has transported their pupils to the Bandon school district for schooling.

How to Make Lenten Menus Interesting

If you're looking for meatless main course dishes that are tasty and hearty, here are two of my favorites. These are so good that they needn't be reserved just for Lent. You'll find them delicious the year around.

FRENCH TOAST TUNA SALAD SANDWICH

For a satisfying lunch I serve these sandwiches along with Cream of Pea Soup. Then for dessert I like a Fro-y Apple Dumpling and plenty of hot coffee or tea.

Make sandwiches using a well-seasoned tuna salad mixture. For each 3 sandwiches mix together 2 slightly beaten eggs, 1/4 cup of milk and 1/4 teaspoon salt. Cut sandwiches in half if desired. Dip in egg and milk mixture. Saute in hot shortening in heavy frying pan, turning to brown both sides. Serve hot.

LIMA BEAN AND CHEESE SALAD

Buttered spinach or Swiss chard, hot bran muffins and chocolate cake for dessert combine with this salad to make a complete supper or lunch.

To 2 cups of cooked dried lima beans, well-drained, add 2 cups finely shredded cabbage, 1 cup American cheese cut in small cubes, and 1/4 cup pickle relish. Toss lightly with Thousand Island Dressing. Serve in bowl lined with cabbage leaves. Serves 6 generously.
