A FAMILY AFFAIR

When working out a family spending plan, remember to include the children. A child's experience in handling money is part of the training home life provides.

Some families start the youngsters off by making them responsible for a small allowance. Then as the children grow older, they learn more and more about the needs and problems of the family as a whole. Children are usually more willing to go without some of the things they would like to have, if they see their share in relation to the needs of others.

Even a four or five-year old can talk over his needs with his parents and agree on a weekly allowance. For a youngster of this age, a small allowance to divide by the old three-penny-formula is often a good plan—a penny to spend, a penny to give, and a penny to save for something later. This will not only take care of the child's need for spending, but will begin valuable training in managing money.

With help from their parents, many teenagers handle the money for most of their clothes and other personal needs. This way, they learn to make decisions, and to meet wisely situations they will have to face when they grow up. Even mistakes in spending will help them avoid mistakes later. It is wise to encourage adolescent youngsters to save part of their allowances for something they need but can't afford to buy all at once.

TESTING PRESSURE COOKER GAUGES

With the canning season not far in the future, now is the time to start checking on supplies and equipment. Pressure cooker gauges will be tested at Oregon State College only during the month of April this year. If gauges have not been tested for two years, it is recommended that they be sent in for testing. The gauge should be removed from the cooker with a wrench. Do not send the lid. Gauges should have tags or adhesive tape securely fastened to them with the name and address of the owner. Do not use musilage. Pad generously with paper and pack into small box. The charge is fifty cents per gauge and twenty-five cents per safety cock. Mail to Professor Wiegand, Food Industries Department, Oregon State College, Corvallis, Oregon. Gauges sent in after April 30th will not be tested. Gauges which are old and rusty should be replaced by new gauges.

DON'T BE A FLOUR HOARDER

Don't hoard flour! It's not only selfish, but unnecessary and unwise, the grain specialists of USDA report. There isn't any shortage of wheat in this country and excessive buying is unnecessary. There is a danger that flour may spoil in home storage, making hoarding wasteful and unwise. Most experienced housewives know that flour can't be kept for a long period of time in the ordinary warm kitchen or apartment without danger of becoming infested with weevils. Commercial bakers, who usually keep up to 45 days' supply on hand, store the flour in rooms specially built for that purpose. These have the necessary air conditioning apparatus to control temperature and humidity. In many homes, especially apartments, flour is often stored on high shelves, where the temperature is above the average of the room. This increases the danger of spoilage. And don't think it can be kept successfully in the home refrigerator, either, because flour takes up moisture and should be kept dry as well as cool. It would be a real tragedy if flour were allowed to spoil in this country at a time it's desperately needed in so many parts of the world.
