Canners Urged To Think of Lunches

Canning for the school lunches is suggested this year by Patricia Smith, emergency assistant home demonstration agent.

A revised bulletin giving information pertaining to this year's problems has been recently sent out from Oregon State college.

This bulletin gives the needed information on the standard amounts of canned foods needed for schools having different numbers of students and suggestions on various ways in which this program can be carried out.

Persons or groups who plan to engage in this canning, either in their homes or in community canning center, should write to the OPA district office, Sugar Rationing Division, 1022 Bedell Building, Portland 4, Oregon. Upon request they will mail an OPA Form B-1340 on which they may apply for additional sugar to be used in preserving foods especially for school lunch use next fall. More information concerning obtaining of sugar is in the above mentioned bulletin.

This year as in last year, the need for school lunches is very important and now while food is more plentiful it is wise to get it stored for the winter.

Subscription Raise Scheduled July 1

Effective July 1, 1946, the yearly subscription price of The Coquille Valley Sentinel will be advanced to \$2.50. Six months subscription will be \$1.50. Subscriptions will be received as far in advance as desired at the old rate of \$2.00 a year until July 1st.

Chevrolets Really Coming Out

Despite restricting factors of national coal and transportation strikes, as well as a variety of tie-ups on the part of suppliers, Chevrolet during the month of May established a new high production record for the auto industry in its post-VJ Day history, producing 58,820 cars and trucks. It was announced here today by Cliff Gulseth of Southwestern Motors.

The 58,820 total includes 30,367 passenger cars and 28,453 trucks, Gulseth said. The comparable monthly total for April, best previous month production-wise, is 47,077 units.
