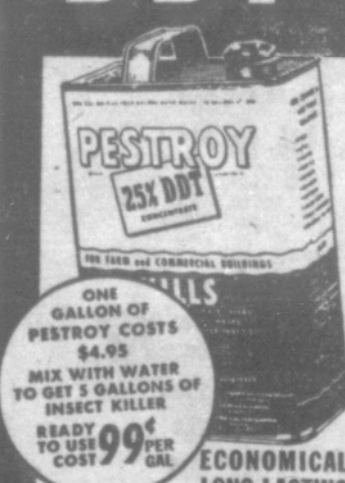
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## 4-H Clubbers To Be At Fair

## Airplane Seeding Lists Being Made

People interested in airplane seeding of range land this year are requested to turn their name, address, and approximate acreage into the county agent's office so plans and arrangements can be made for seeding this year.

Several thousands of acres have been seeded by airplane in the last several years with an average cost of about one dollar per acre for hiring the plane and crew, reports George H. Jenkins, county agent.

Anyone participating in the Agricultural Conservation Program is eligible for a return ranging from ten to sixty cents per pound of seed, depending on the kinds of perennial grasses and legumes sown.

Some of the approved perennial grasses and legumes are: meadow fescue, highland bentgrass, Seaside bentgrass, Astoria bentgrass, lotus major, lotus corniculatus, ladine clover, subterranean clover, orchard grass, alta fescue, chewing fescue, and perennial ryegrass.

## Many Cars Listed In State of Oregon

Record motor car registrations marked the first half of this year in Oregon. Vehicles to the number of 423,000 were licensed, with fees adding to three and a quarter million dollars, it has been announced by Robert S. Farrell, Jr., Secretary of State.

The number of vehicles has swelled seven per cent over last year. The great bulk—336,000—are passenger cars, with trucks and light deliveries totaling 90,000. Of the rest 3,000 were motorcycles and 1300 buses. Every classification showed gains.

"The tremendous mileage piled up by this record number of vehicles," said Farrell, "explains how the death rate in Oregon is falling, although the actual toll in numbers is increasing."

In view of the increasing shift of fatalities to rural areas, motorists and pedestrians were urged to exercise new caution on inter-city highways and main-traveled roads. The first half of this year over 70 per cent of Oregon's traffic deaths took place outside towns or cities.
