checked when buying woolen yardage. If the material has not been shrunk, it may be taken to a tailor or dry cleaning establishment for shrinking or may be done at home.

Many conflicting directions have been given for shrinking wool at home. Mrs. Abrego reports that recent tests have shown that pressing the entire piece of wool with a steam iron is a simple and satisfactory method, if care is taken to hold and press the weave and not to stretch or pull in the process.

Without a steam iron, it is necessary first to dampen the wool thoroughly and then press it with a moderately warm iron under a press cloth. Rolling the wool in a damp sheet is a simple way to dampen it. Dip a sheet in water, wring it out, then spread it flat on a table and lay the wool material, flat and straight, on the sheet. Roll sheet and wool together firmly but not tightly. Allow to stand overnight. Then press wool on the wrong side under a dry press cloth with no pulling or stretching.

If the fabric is extra wide, it may be easier to leave it doubled, as it comes in the bolt, during dampening.

If so, the roll should sand a few so that the entire piece will shrink hours, then be reversed and re-rolled evenly before pressing.

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HOME HINTS

Care of Your Washing Machine

Let your washing machine do an efficient job for you by keeping it in good repair, says Helen Abrego, home demonstration agent of Coos county. Mrs. Abrego suggests the following care for the family washer:

1. Keep the machine oiled.
2. Check bolts and screws frequently to see that they are tight.
3. Wash by the clock — saves clothes, the machine, time and fuel.
4. Wash the right clothes load for your machine. Avoid overloading.
5. After washing clothes, wash inside of machine with soapy water, rinse, and dry. Remove stains with a fine scouring powder. Flush drain thoroughly and see that it is free from lint.
6. Wipe wringer rolls with damp cloth. If tension is adjustable release pressure.
7. Keep lid propped up an inch or two to let machine air when not in use. Leave drain open.

Shrinking Wool Goods
A wool dress that comes back from the cleaners a size too small is a tragedy in a woman's life. To avoid it, wool goods of any kind should be properly shrunk before it is made up, says Helen Abrego, home demonstration agent.

Some woolen materials are already shrunk and have the words, "Ready for Sewing" on the selvage. This is a point which should be carefully
