University of Oregon, Eugene, Nov. 21—(Special)—The completion of the second of two large dormitories for single veterans and the opening of the cafeteria on the commons between the Veterans' dorms, capable of seating 1000 men, will greatly alleviate the housing shortage for veterans who plan to attend the University of Oregon beginning winter term, announced Dr. Earl M. Pallett, assistant to the president.

The newly erected dormitory will house five units, each with single, double, and triple rooms, study rooms, and central living rooms. Between 300 and 400 more men can be accommodated, Dr. Pallett points out.

New students planning to attend the university winter term are urged to contact Mrs. Genevieve Turnipseed, director of dormitories, to assure campus housing. Credentials must be in the registrar's office before housing can be assigned.

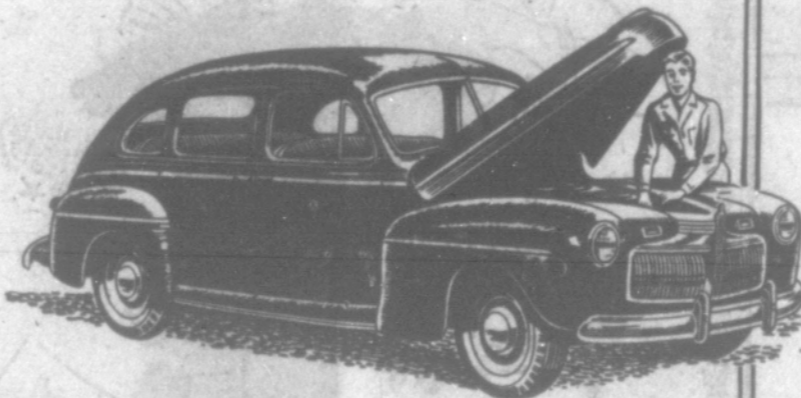

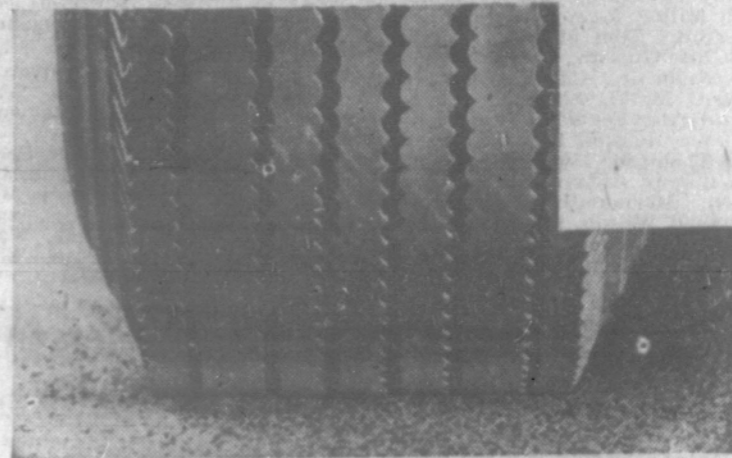

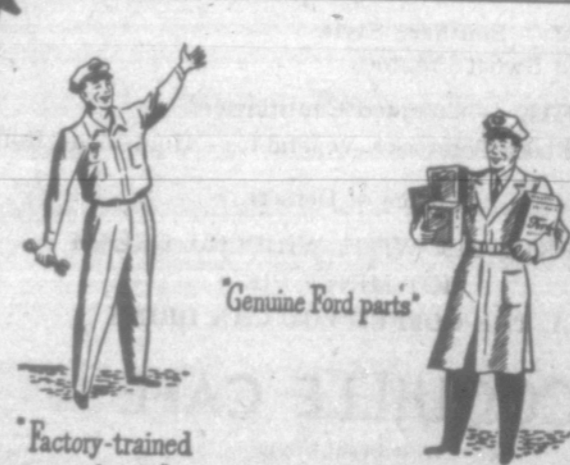
