How To Fix A Leaking Roof

WOOD SHINGLES Locate the leak inside and push a wire or other instrument through the roof at that point. The spot can then be located from the outside and a thin shingle pushed under the wood shingles to stop the leak.

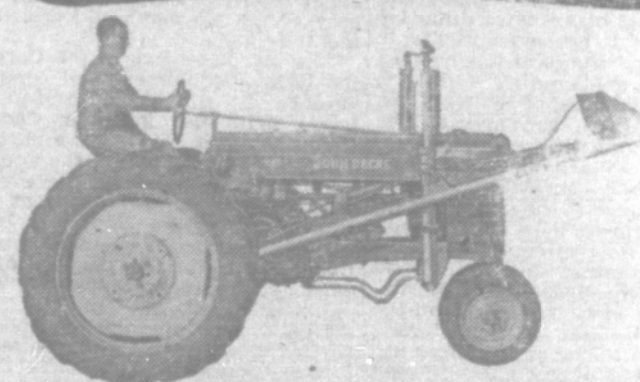
