Planning Group To Study Henry St. Traffic

The members of the planning commission in session last Wednesday went on record as favoring an immediate study of the Henry street traffic, and the condition of the Henry street bridge. Movement of people and cars from the North End of the city will be compiled to make up data on usage of the bridge and need for some immediate improvement.

A study on a substitute for the bridge when it is eventually condemned will be made also.

Coulter street has been under study for some time as an alternate route across the fill, but no decisions will be placed before the council until all facts are in hand.

Continued work on the complete mapping of Coquille and study of population, school children, land use, and other pertinent facts will go on with a topographical map to be made soon showing all usable land within the city's boundaries.

Robert Pierson, League of Oregon Cities consultant, was in session with the group as was Patty Geaney, clerk of the planning commission.

Succeeding Mayor Dave Biegger as chairman of the group will be R. P. Stuller. John Perkins is the new member appointed by Mayor Biegger to fill the vacancy on the commission left when Mr. Biegger assumed his duties as city head.

Work on the recreational center for Coquille is also due to come under study.

A study is also being made of house numbering in Coquille and new correct numbers may be assigned all houses if the need appears great enough.

A base line will be set for this. J. N. Gearhart may also be asked to aid in getting a base map and base traverse with base monuments set for the city so property lines can be determined accurately.

Mule Deer Abound In Tulelake Area

"Mule deer are plentiful in our area this year," said Clark Fensler of Tulelake, Calif., and a former business man here who with Mrs. Fensler was visiting Mr. and Mrs. Dutch Clinton and Mr. and Mrs. George Burr over the week-end.
