"PROVE ME"

The above caption is lifted from Malachi, chapter three, verse ten and is not only a statement of what can be done, but is also a challenge as to what we should do if we follow the formula as given in God's word.

God has spoken, if certain rules as portrayed in his word will be followed that spiritual and temporal blessings are surely to follow and will be so manifest that God and his word can be as surely proven as correct and true as a mathematical arrival can be proven.

Of course finances are specifically mentioned in Malachi 3, and that enters into our religion as a factor with the statement that the disobedient in the financial realm are "cursed," verse 9, and "robbers," verse 8; all because they did not give God his financial right viz. tithes and offerings, (the tithe means one-tenth of our income) and is a necessary part of our obligation to God and the proof of the obedience therein will be "Blessing," verse 10. No Christian can be blessed of God right-ly without meeting this obligation. But the life of the Christian who has qualified along other lines can prove God assuredly as we prove mathematics.

Here is an illustration; God tells us in Matthew that there is life in the word, and Psalm 1:2 says we are to ruminate or eat the word of God and it will become life in us. One of God's children was sick in the hospital in pain, when they began to take the word of God, read the Bible and the law of the word began to be proven and that one was renewed by God through his word and pain was assuaged and finally left, a law was kept. Take the law of prayer, proving God in prayer, I John 3:21, 22 says if we keep his commandments and do those things pleasing in his sight, that we can have whatsoever we desire, if the law of obedience is kept, the gracious reward is co-operation in prayer with God above and an answered prayer. Wonderful. No amount of penance will atone for disobedience in the life of prayer as well as other graces spoken of in the word of God.

As laws of the physical, if kept, will produce health so in the spiritual. God is clearly proven concerning the law of faith. We saw a party in anguish of soul for a year, trying seemingly to find solace in prayer and seeking God but holding back in obedience which produces faith, but not finding help until they vowed their obedience to God in walking in the light of his word and immediately they were at peace with God. God was proven, that his word is true but nothing availed in securing help until that obedience was promised that produced the necessary faith for peace with God. Thus we can take this great subject into every line of life and prove God's word true.
