

Search On For Oldest Chevrolet Truck To Be Found Licensed And In Use

Owners of early-model Chevrolet trucks in the Coquille Valley were invited today to participate in a nationwide search by the Chevrolet Motor Division to locate the oldest Chevrolet truck still in active service in the United States.

"The owner of the oldest truck will be presented with a brand-new Advance-Design Chevrolet truck and may choose any standard model in the current line of Chevrolet commercial cars and trucks," Cliff Gulseth, manager of Southwestern Motors, said today.

Trucks entered in the search must be driven to a Chevrolet dealership, where official entry blanks are available. The search ends June 15, 1947, and the winner will be notified on or before June 20, 1947.

"We have a large number of old Chevrolet trucks still in every-day

service in the Coos-Curry area," Mr. Gulseth said, "and the winning vehicle may be on a farm or engaged in some other hauling work right in our own community."

The winning truck, Mr. Gulseth said, must carry 1947 license plates. The oldest Chevrolet truck will be determined by the earliest serial number. In cases where the serial number is lost or illegible, the number may be established by an original bill of sale or other legal documents showing the original serial number.

Entries must be filed with a Chevrolet dealer by midnight June 15. Only vehicles manufactured as trucks by Chevrolet are eligible, and the search is open to all truck owners with the exception of employees of the Chevrolet Motor Division, dealers in cars and trucks and their employees.

Free Dual-Control Cars Set For Schools

Oregon high schools may become eligible to apply for free dual-control driver training cars for high school training programs through participation in the teacher training course scheduled for Portland August 11-15, Ray Conway, manager of the Oregon State Motor Association, announced today.

The course is sponsored by the Portland Extension Center of the State System of Higher Education. Instruction will be in charge of Prof. Amos Neyhart, driver training consultant for the American Automobile Association. Teachers in charge of driver education and training classes in Oregon high schools may receive standard training at this course.

"High schools with teachers who have been retained in this course are eligible to apply for free dual-control cars provided by a motor company (Pontiac) through the courtesy of the American Automobile Association," Conway said. Oregon arrangements may be made through the State Motor Association, Oregon affiliate of the AAA.

"These driver training cars are new

vehicles, equipped with basic AAA dual controls designed to facilitate actual behind-the-wheel instruction," Conway explained. "They are given schools on a loan basis and the only local costs involved are insurance, maintenance and operation, getting the car from the zone office and returning it, and \$25 for installation and use of the dual controls."

"The cars may be assigned to schools which have qualified in charge of an approved driver education and training course. Oregon now has such a course and the teacher training course to be held in Portland this summer offers teachers the opportunity of becoming qualified instructors in this work."

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Government Wants Stenographers

Federal Civil Service announces examinations for appointment to the positions of stenographer and typist.

Persons who desire permanent positions will have an opportunity to file for a civil service examination leading to probational appointment with permanent classified civil service status in these positions in various federal government agencies in the states of Idaho, Montana, Oregon and Washington.

The entrance salary for these positions range from \$1756 to \$2394 a year.

Applicants for these examinations will be required to take a written examination.

Applicants must be between the ages of 18 and 62, except that these age limits may be waived for veterans and under certain conditions for war service indefinite employees.

Further information on these examinations and the necessary application form for applying may be obtained from the Secretary, Board of U. S. Civil Service Examiners, at any first or second-class post office or from the Director, Eleventh U. S. Civil Service Region, Room 4, Central Building, Seattle 4, Washington. Applications must be received by the Director, Eleventh U. S. Civil Service Region, 457 Central Building, Seattle 4, Washington, not later than June 9, 1947.
