Chinese Couple Visited Former Coquille Friends

Mrs. Euphemia Dimick opened the front door of her home at 335 SE 80th avenue Wednesday night and had a pleasant surprise. Standing before her was a grinning, well-groomed Chinese man, Sou Chan, whom she had not seen for 18 years. Sou Chan was just a boy when he first rang Mrs. Dimick's doorbell in Coquille. The lad wanted to learn English and he made that first visit to persuade her to be his teacher. At that time Mrs. Dimick was teaching crippled children in their homes, so she agreed to tutor the Chinese boy for \$5 a month.

Errors Corrected
It took her just eight months to teach him sufficient English to let him go fortune-hunting in Chicago. From Chicago she received letters and, true to her promise, she returned those to him in school-teacher fashion with all errors corrected. He compiled them and has kept them as his first American textbook.

The last letter she received from him was in 1931. At that time, Sou Chan sent her a gift from China. Later she learned he was in the importing business. From then until Wednesday night the teacher and her pupil friend lost connections. Both moved. Mrs. Dimick went to Salem, later to St. Helens and finally, about two months ago, to her present home, where her daughter also lives.

Turns Detective
Sou Chan and his wife, a former Boston Chinese girl, recently decided it was time to find his oldest American friend. So the now prosperous couple made a trip from New York city to Oregon for that purpose.

He had to turn veritable detective to find her, but find her he did. Mrs. Dimick has learned that her pupil is now a successful restaurant operator in New York.

She is not surprised. "He has the same wonderful personality he had as a boy," she explained.
