Out Door STUFF...

The second part of the split season on ducks and geese opened with a bang, December 23rd of our now departed year—1947. The season not opened merely with a bang but with thousands of bangs, for the roaring of shotguns echoed from morn' till dark throughout the marshlands of the Coquille river valley. And when we state that the shooting started at dawn and lasted until dark in many spots, we are stating plain facts.

We predicted well in advance of the opening date of the season that the slaughter of birds would be appalling if weather conditions were just right on the opening date. The conditions were ideal for the duck hunter and the slaughter was truly appalling, for not being content to bag the limit within legal shooting hours, there were dozens of so-called sportsmen that took advantage of not only the poor birds, but of their law-abiding brother sportsmen as well, to the extent of shooting as high as an hour before shooting time and quitting only when darkness cut off their view of the birds coming into the fields to roost.

The legal shooting hour was high noon on the opening day. At 10:50 a. m. the first shots were fired by one hogish individual. The rest of the gang refrained from joining him, but at 11:30 a. m. it appeared that three out of every five hunters were blasting it to the birds.

Throughout the season the illegal shooting continued. It started fully 45 minutes before legal shooting time each morning and continued up until darkness fell each evening. The law-abiding sportsmen were forced to stand in their blinds each morning and watch hundreds of ducks wheel past well within range. By being law-abiding, by giving the birds a chance and by refraining from shooting until legal shooting time these law-abiding hunters missed the cream of the shooting. The illegal sportsmen got the real shooting, scattered the birds to the four winds and made it mighty difficult for the law-abiding fellows—the guys that believe in giving the birds a half a chance at least and are sincere in their desire to divide shooting with their brother sportsmen and not seek to hog the whole show by going off on illegal shooting rampages each shooting day of the season.

We have hunted ducks since we were able to carry a scatter-gun. We have watched the vast willow-covered marshlands converted into open fields. We have watched the numbers of the great flocks of ducks dwindle to the present pitiful numbers of today, but during our entire career, never have we observed such a reckless disregard for the law, such downright demonstrations of actual game hogishness as was apparent the past split season.

Can it be the new crop of hunters that have taken to the marshes that are responsible for all the illegal shooting and the downright poor sportsmanship demonstrated? Even in the old days of market hunting we never saw anything to equal the past season, so far as a total disregard of sportsmanship is concerned.

One morning we had the pleasure to occupy a blind that adjoined that of three other hunters. Thirty-five minutes before shooting time arrived, shotguns began blasting all about us. Duck wheeled by our blinds in great numbers and each and everyone of us expressed ourselves in no mild language concerning the illegal shooters. There wasn't one of the four of us that could not have killed the limit within five minutes from the time the shooting started, but we all held our fire until actual shooting time arrived. By then the ducks were scattered and were flying high and it took us all four the better part of the morning to secure the limit. If those illegal shooters had held their fire until legal shooting time, each and every one of us would have enjoyed some wonderful shooting, the illegal shooters included.

We are trusting that there are no more split seasons for the sake of the fast disappearing birds, for as we remarked not long ago in this column, it is a shame to cease shooting birds and then have them feed around within a stone throw of highways, become as tame as your barnyard fowl and about as trusting, and then open the season on them. It is simply murder! We believe that we are safe in stating that at least one-third, if not more, of all the ducks that were in the valley at the opening of the season were slaughtered in the season ended. And two-thirds of that slaughtered number were bagged in illegal fashion—before and after legal shooting time.

Well, the bloody slaughter is over and it is not so much the poor birds that were killed that we regret, as it is the manner in which they were slain. They never received a break throughout the season for each day they were double-crossed by illegal shooters. We are trusting that in other seasons sees active wardens in the marshes and wholesale arrests made to curb such shooting as was witnessed this season, for it will be then and only then that law abiding hunters will have an opportunity to compete with the game hogs.

Those balloon silk rain jackets and those other water repellent jackets are fine things to wear if you desire to keep warm and the upper part of your torso dry, but in case of a heavy rain those same garments' tails act as a funnel to deposit water down your boot tops and to wet the parts of your legs and rear construction that occupies the space where the boots leave off and the tail of the garments start. What is a mystery to us is why the manufacturers
