Reports of welfare work and various activities of each society for the year 1947 were heard and compiled by the secretary, Ruth Caspan. It was shown that 7269 articles of clothing and comforts were shipped for overseas relief. In addition many gift packages of food and clothing were sent by mail to individuals.

Mrs. Charles Watkins, chairman of the constitution and by-laws committee, presented the drafted document which was accepted as read.

Elder D. N. Rinder, home missionary secretary of the Oregon conference, spoke briefly of Dorcas welfare work and introduced the guest speaker of the day, Elder C. S. Joyce, home missionary secretary of the North Pacific Union.

Elder Joyce spoke at length regarding the activities of women in the work of the Church and social and humanitarian activities, speaking first of Miriam, then of Queen Esther and concluding with Susan Sesley, Florence Nightingale, Clara Barton and other philanthropists of modern times.

The noon luncheon was served by the ladies of Coos Bay, Myrtle Point and Coquille.

Special music for the day was furnished by Elder and Mrs. J. J. Robertson and Mrs. Cochran.

Chairman for the day was Mrs. Ellen Robertson, vice president. An invitation from the Roseburg Dorcas society asking the federation to meet in Roseburg for the next sessions was accepted.
