

Noted Bible Teacher To Visit Coquille

Howard Carter, author and Bible teacher of London, England, will be guest of the Assembly of God Church for a four-day Bible conference, Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, April 22 to 25, according to word from Reverend Howard S. May, pastor. Rev. Mr. Carter has been principal of the Pentecostal Bible school situated in Hampstead, England, for 27 years. For 11 years, he was General Superintendent of the Assemblies of God movement in the British Isles, bearing the burden of the work through the tragic years of war. For 24 years he has been a member of the executive. He has traveled extensively in Bible conference work, having visited over 40 countries around the world. His high teaching ministry has been greatly appreciated by large conventions and camp meetings in these many places.

The services will commence nightly at 7:30, and at 11 a. m. on Sunday. The public is invited.

Call Shows Bank Has \$5,246,065

The Coquille branch of First National bank of Portland shows deposits of \$5,246,065 and loans of \$1,166,051 in the April 12 report which answers the quarterly call of the Comptroller of currency, according to Lewis Wiltshire, manager.

Loan volume has increased since the report at the end of 1947. A slight decrease in deposits during the same period reflects the general condition of other banks throughout the state and the nation, and is a frequent seasonal characteristic because of income tax payments, Wiltshire said.

First National bank of Portland, branches and affiliates, reported total deposits of \$592,246,614 and loans of \$149,170,140 to again lead all Oregon banks in both departments.

Increase in loans indicates more money at work in Coquille and in Oregon, Wiltshire declared. "Bank credit is the lubricant that makes our economic wheels go round. Its expansion reflects local and state gains in population and industrial development which are earning national attention."
