Non High Board Members And Rural School Board Member To Be Elected

Two Non high school board members and one Rural school board member will be elected at the annual school meetings in some of the districts on June 21st.

Zone I and Zone II of the Non high school district of Coos county will each elect a member. The present member from Zone I is Clyde Deal, Empire. In Zone II the one holding office is Clifford Thorwald, Bunker Hill.

The school districts represented in Zone I are Sunny Hill Consolidated, Kentuck Inlet, Empire, Charleston, Willanch, and Lakeside. In Zone II, the school districts are Millington, Bunker Hill and Delmar.

Petitions to be circulated for candidates may be secured from the office of the county school superintendent.

Teacher Shortage Still Critical In Schools

The shortage of adequately trained teachers still continues in the elementary field. Dr. Elmo Stevenson, president of Southern Oregon College of Education, Ashland, said today while visiting in Coquille. While here he was a speaker to the annual Woman's club banquet at the Community building.

Numbers of young men and women training for the field of elementary education continues to be much less than the demand for teachers, the college president stated. However, in the field of secondary education, with a few exceptions such as home economics and industrial arts and girls' physical education, there are many more trained teachers for each available position.

Teachers' salaries are now at a high point, the college chief said, and there are few jobs in the country at present that pay as well for the first five years' work as do teaching positions in the schools of the nation.

Dr. Stevenson said he has found many G. I. men interested in education, and that they will help to fill the ranks of depleted teachers as they are now attending training schools.

Tax Reduction Urged By McKay

State Senator Douglas McKay, Salem, candidate for Republican nomination for governor, in a Portland radio address, said State Treasurer Leslie Scott's recent report that current income tax receipts are 50 per cent over last year justifies reduction of state income taxes by repeal of 1947 amendment to the income tax law which lowered personal exemptions.

McKay said current receipts far exceeded the estimates submitted to the legislature, and stated he voted for the amendment on the basis of the estimates the legislature had before them.
