Attends School—John Shilling is attending a three-day Westinghouse service school in Portland this week.

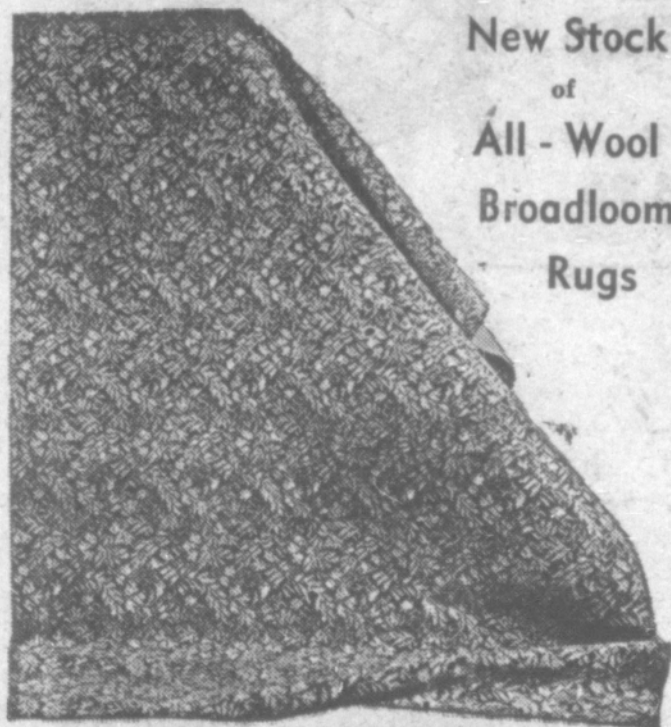

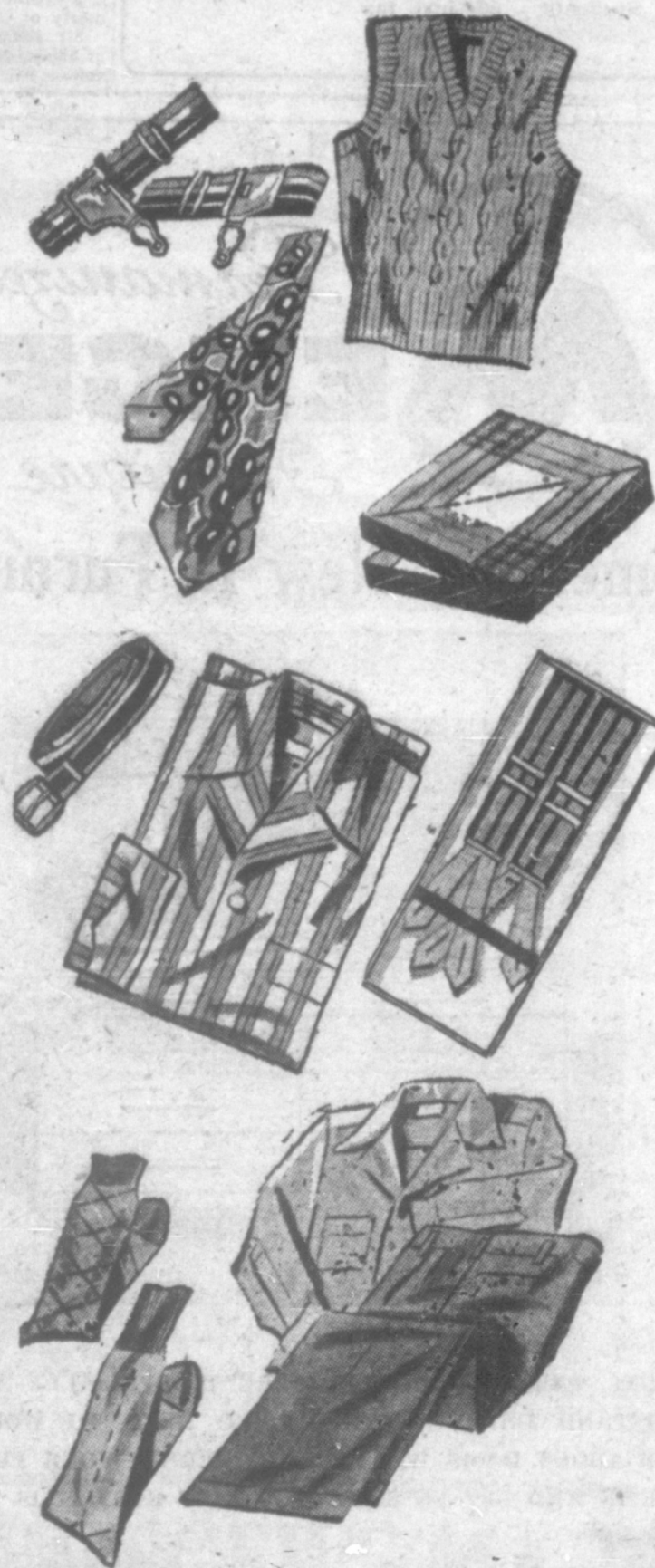
