**Jazz Concert  
Slated June 21**

Stan Keaton and his record-breaking orchestra in rhythmic jazz will present a concert of progressive jazz in the Coos Bay high school auditorium the night of Monday, June 21, it was announced today.

The Coos Bay appearance follows by only a few weeks the orchestra's concert in famed Carnegie hall in which all previous attendance records for a modern orchestra were shattered. The orchestra currently is on a tour of the United States.

Since its first appearance seven years ago in a little beach town in southern California, the Kenton orchestra has become the nation's No. 1 jazz organization, grabbing top position in many popularity polls conducted by national magazines.

In recent months the Kenton orchestra has been presented almost exclusively in the concert field, although it is rated as the finest dance band in America by the country's toughest critics.

"Progressive jazz as we know it today, is an art form that cannot possibly be presented in any other manner than through concerts," Kenton states. "Because we believe, and are determined to present to the public the finest music we are capable of, we realize that it must be done in concert form where we are not hampered by a percentage of the people who are demanding dance music, buying popcorn, or trying to make a date."
