**JOHN W. LENEVE**  
John W. Leneve, born at Parkersburg, Oregon. When about 12 years old he moved to Coquille with his parents, where his father bought a lot and built a home on the same lot. As he was a doctor he built a drugstore, the first in Coquille. He ran the drugstore and practiced medicine and was a regular physician until about 1906 when he retired.

John assisted his father in the store for several years and was assistant postmaster, as his father was postmaster for Coquille under Grover Cleveland's administration. (John was still a regular druggist at the time of his death, always retaining his membership.)

He received his schooling in the regular schools and special night schools in Coquille. After his father retired, John put in a stock of general merchandise in the same building and conducted it for several years.

After he sold his store he was in California for about a year and he also, with his father, mother and wife and boy made a trip to the Hawaiian Islands. After returning to Coquille he was in various work. Was in the real estate business awhile and also in the confectionery business. He also worked in the First National and the Farmers and Merchants Bank of Coquille, also in the Bank of Bandon and Flanagan & Bennett Bank of Myrtle Point.

He was interested in the building of the Coquille Ice & Cold Storage Plant Creamery and which burnt down in about a couple of years. He was agent for Wells Fargo Express of Coquille. He worked for awhile in the Sheriff's office, also in the Treasurer's office and County Clerk's office. He was councilman and City Recorder for Coquille.

He was Postmaster at Coquille, Oregon for 8 years under president Wilson's administration. In 1924 he was appointed Deputy County Clerk and Book-keeper for Coos county, which position he held for over 20 years, until June 15, 1945, when he was discharged by County Clerk L. W. Oddy. Since that time he has been unemployed and living with his son and his wife at Bandon & Remote.

He was a Mason and had a 50 year pin and also belonged to Woodman of the World.
