## July 31st Last Day To Reinstate G.-I. Insurance Without New Medical Exams

Last day for veterans to reinstate their lapsed GI life insurance on a "comparative health" basis is July 31st, Shirley T. Brannock, Veterans Administration representative for this area, pointed out today.

Ex-GI's may reinstate any amount of their service insurance—from \$1000 to \$10,000 in multiples of \$500, Brannock stated. Before August 1, term policies can be restored in most instances without a physical examination.

Only steps necessary this month are a short, three-question form which

certifies that the veteran's health is as good now as when his policy lapsed, and payment of two months' premiums.

After July 31, veterans still may reinstate service policies, but if they have lapsed for more than three months a "physical" will be required.

About 300,000 ex-GI's in the Pacific Northwest have no GI insurance in force now and are eligible to reinstate up to three billion dollars of this low-cost protection, Brannock added. Nearly one-third of these are in Oregon.



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## Coquille Men Named On Board

The official appointment of Claude G. Stotts as vice-president of the Oregon Coast association for Coos county by Charles A. Ross, president of the association, was announced following a meeting of the budget committee at the Tioga Hotel.

Also appointed by President Ross upon recommendation by the budget committee were J. E. Norton of Coquille to chairman of the budget committee and Robert Thompson of Coquille as a member of the budget committee.

The budget committee approved the semi-annual statements of receipts and expenditures of the Oregon Coast Association for January 1 through June 30, 1948, as presented by the Manager Verne H. Tinnerstet, and authorized the printing of more Oregon Coast folders.

Dates of the annual convention of the Oregon Coast association have been set for November 7, 8, and 9 after suggestion of these dates by the budget committee. This convention is to be held at Newport.

Manager Verne Tinnerstet reported that the Oregon Coast association is at the present time running a series of ads, "Keep Cool on the Oregon Coast," in the Bakersfield Californian, Fresno Bee and San Diego Tribune-Sun Union newspapers in California, which are bringing numerous inquiries daily.

Tinnerstet reported on a recent trip into California, south to Gaberville, in the interests of the Oregon Coast association, to investigate road conditions and rumors, and to distribute folders.

## Presents List Of County Legislators

Emil Peterson of North Bend has prepared a list of Oregon legislators from Coos county from 1855 to 1947, and it makes a lot of interesting reading. The list reads like a Who's Who in the county, and old-timers will know many of the names. Mr. Peterson is an historian for the Coos-Curry Pioneer and Historical association and also conducts a pioneer radio hour.

## Shep Fields May Play In Coquille

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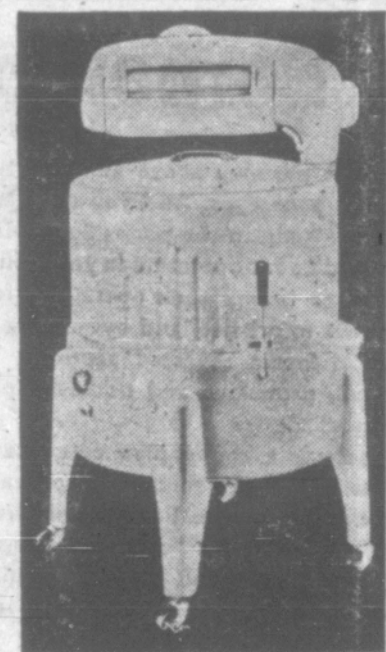
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
