Mrs. Stauff points out the following facts about tuberculosis; tuberculosis is caused by a germ; can't inherit tuberculosis from your parents; you can have tuberculosis without feeling sick; the doctor can tell if you have tuberculosis by x-rays and simple tests; tuberculosis can be cured if found early enough and treated properly; the tuberculosis hospital is the best place to go for treatment and to protect others from your germs.

Plan Idaho Trip — Mr. and Mrs. Evan Alborn will take a short vacation trip to Idaho next month.

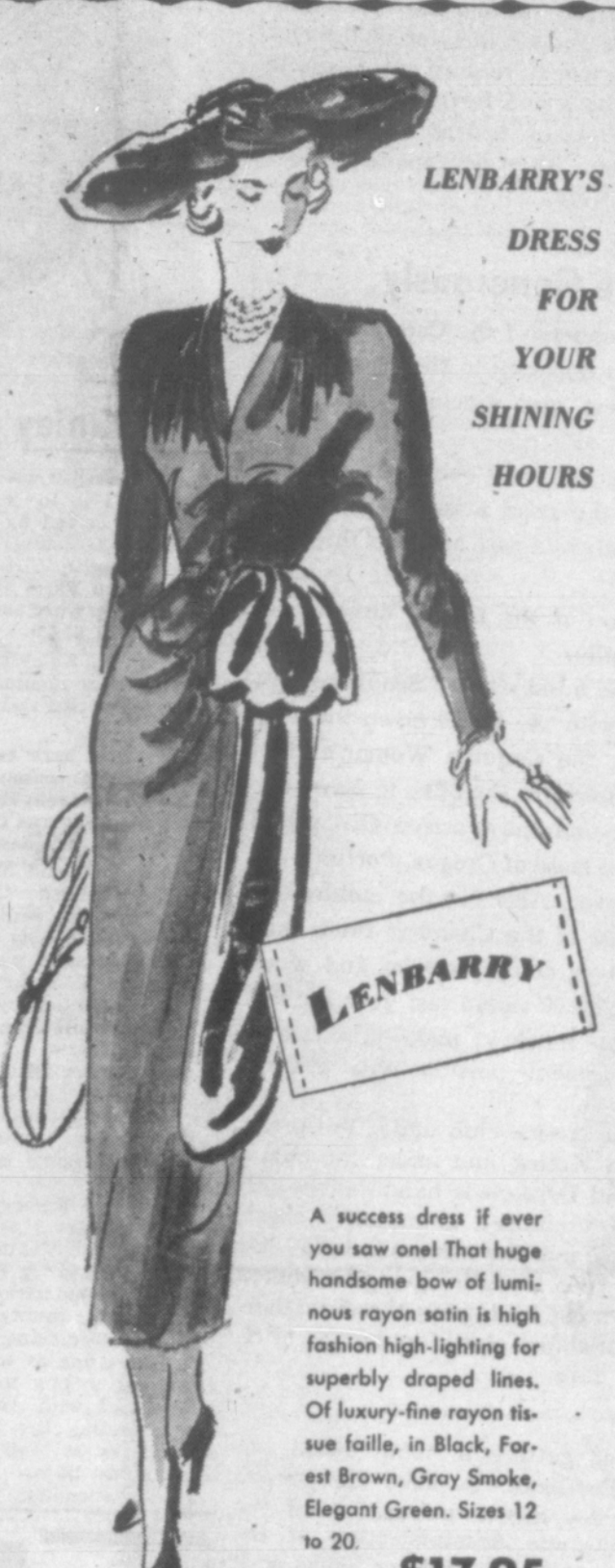
