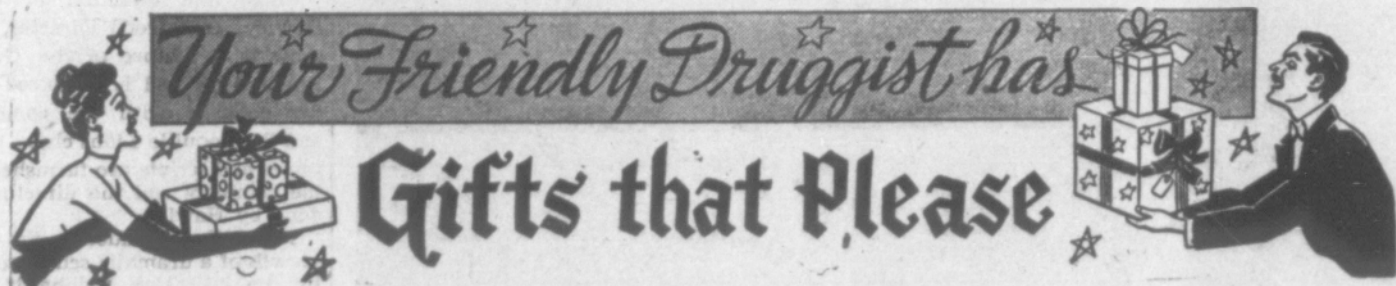

In charge of the arrangements is the Membership and Emblem committee, with Sylvia Irelan as chairman.



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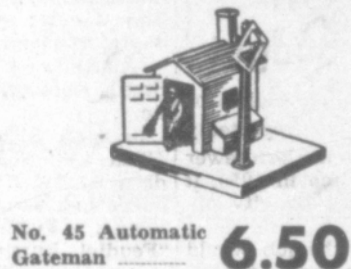
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
