New Instruction Classes Planned

A new class of instruction for Confirmation will be started at St. James' Episcopal Church on Monday, January 17, at 8 p. m. in the Parish hall.

Due to demands upon his schedule this summer, Bishop Dagwell will visit St. James' on March 13 to confirm the new class rather than in May as his custom has been. Thus, this will be the last confirmation class available until Fall.

The instruction will cover the history of the Christian Church, the doctrines of the Episcopal Church, the ceremonial and vestments, and the Church government.

Fr. Lessing stresses that there is no obligation imposed on those who attend these sessions. It is customary for visitors to attend out of interest in history and Church matters. Such persons are welcome.

The last class presented to the Bishop in November, 1948, was the largest in St. James' history and it is Fr. Lessing's desire to make this new one even larger.

Next week, January 10 to 14, St. James' will conduct a mission during which the main doctrines of the Church will be presented in an informal manner in short services each night in the week. The services will begin at 8 p. m. There will also be a celebration of the Holy Eucharist every morning at 10 a. m. The public are invited to attend the evening meetings.
