Christians Seat Church Officers

Officers of the Coquille Christian church for the year 1949 who were recently installed, by the pastor, Rev. The annual pastor's report showed that Mr. Soward had conducted 92 regular services, nine special services and assisted with

eight services during the year. He had conducted 14 funerals, and 17 weddings, and had made 725 personal calls, travelling 12,659 miles by car.

The Sunday school report showed that the average attendance during the year had been 158.96. Attendance was down from the average of 170 in 1947.

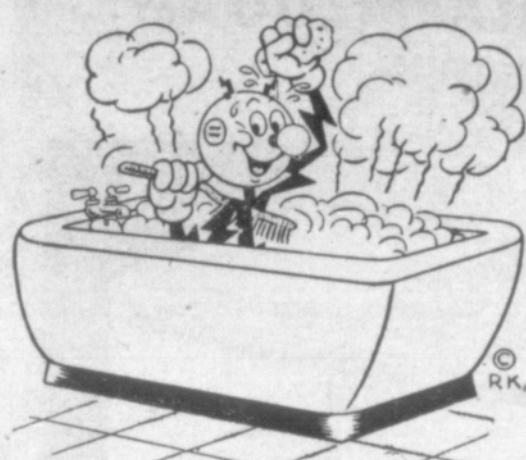

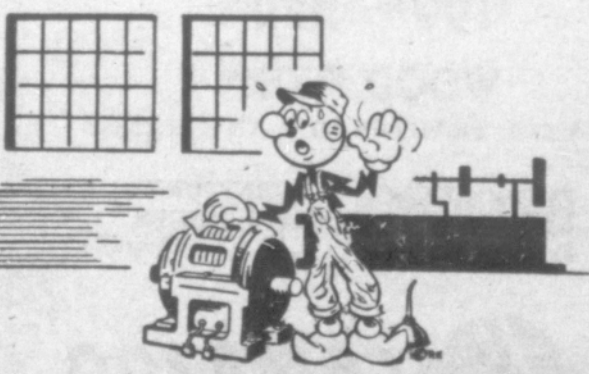
IN YOUR HOME:

YOUR BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENT:

Turn off or reduce to a minimum all display and ornamental lighting between 4:30 and 6:30 p. m. Reduce air conditioning and use of electrically operated equipment during these critical hours. Cut the use of outdoor and indoor lighting to a minimum between 4:30 and 6:30 p. m.



THE INDUSTRIAL PLANT:

Reduce use of all electrically operated machinery and equipment to a minimum during the hours of 11:00 a. m. to noon and 4:30 to 6:30 p. m. Also eliminate during this critical period all ornamental and less essential lighting.
