VA ADVISES VETERANS TO CHECK INSURANCE

An alarming number of World War II veterans in the Pacific Northwest each month risk loss of their National Service Life Insurance through tardiness or carelessness in paying premiums, the Veterans Administration reports.

A survey recently completed by the VA disclosed that over 37 per cent of the 170,000 active G. I. insurance accounts of Northwest veterans are being paid during the 31-day "grace period" allowed on delinquent accounts. Eleven per cent, or 19,000 veterans, regularly pay their premiums during the last two weeks of the grace period.

Most alarming, the VA said, is the fact that over 3,400 veterans each month mail insurance payments "after" the 31-day grace period. Policies of these veterans are lapsed by the VA, leaving the veterans and their families without the protection until reinstatement requirements are completed.

The VA also pointed out that hundreds of veterans fail to sign checks, send checks or money orders made out to companies or organizations having no connection with the VA, or fail to provide identification by which the funds may be posted to their accounts.

Veterans who are not certain of the status of their G. I. insurance may find out by writing the VA Insurance Service, District 11, Exchange Building, Seattle. Using the yellow VA premium payment envelope and making checks or money orders payable to the Treasurer of the United States will mean faster, more accurate service, the VA said.

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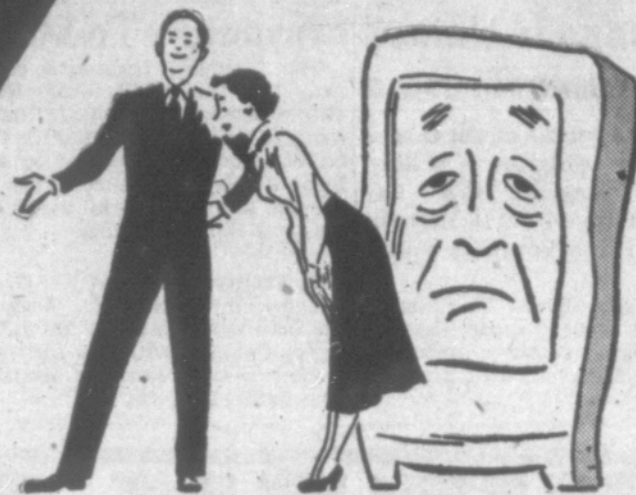

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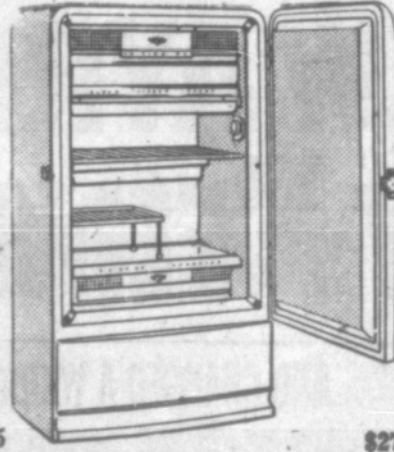
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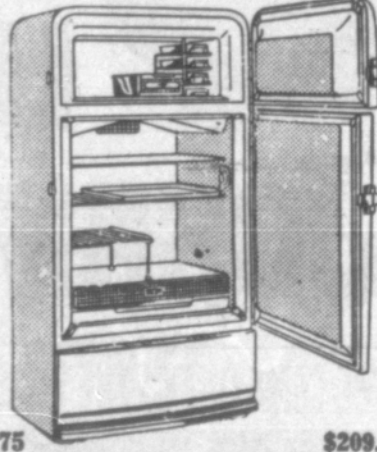


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
