At Jim's Market—Harold Dey is on a two week vacation from his work at Jim's Market in Coquille. During his absence Chester Wood is assisting at the store.



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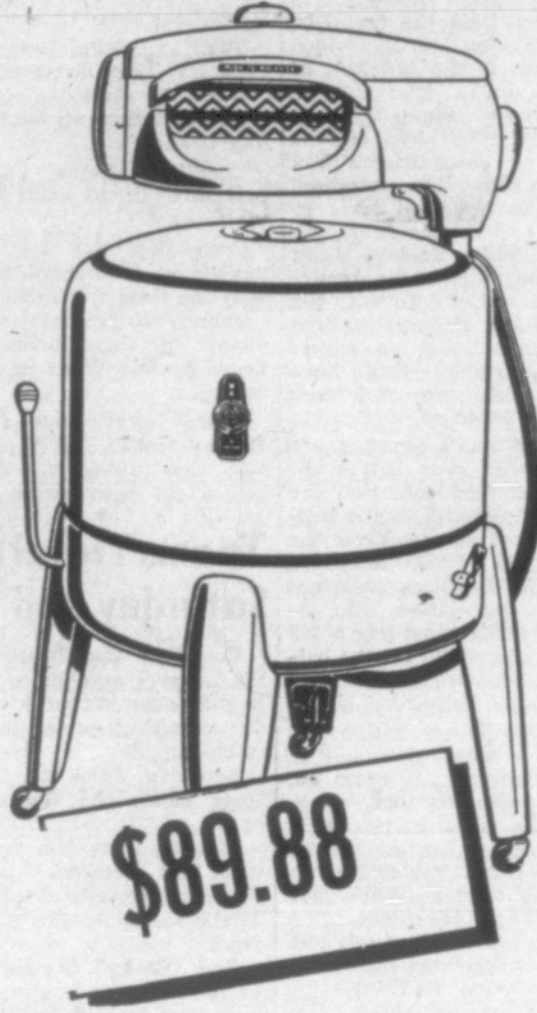
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
