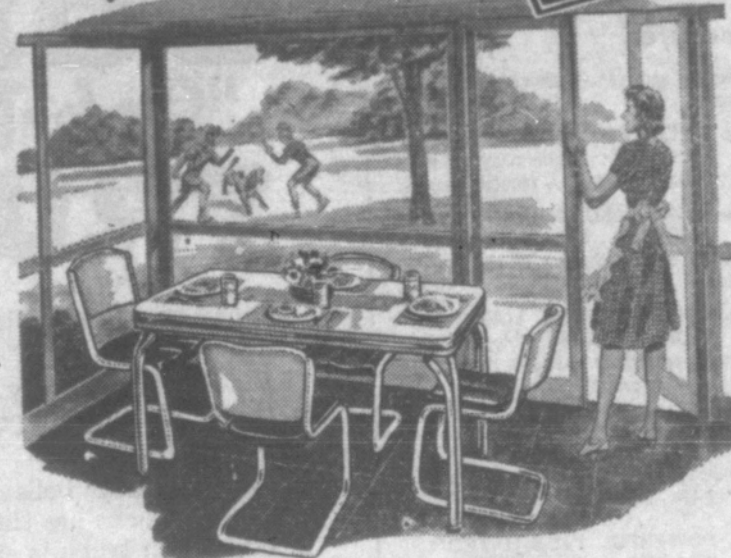
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Five Generations Take Part In Reunion Of Chowning Family At Centralia

Fishing At The Rogue—Jack Bowen, accompanied by Bill Jones of Coos Bay, fished at Rogue river for several days.



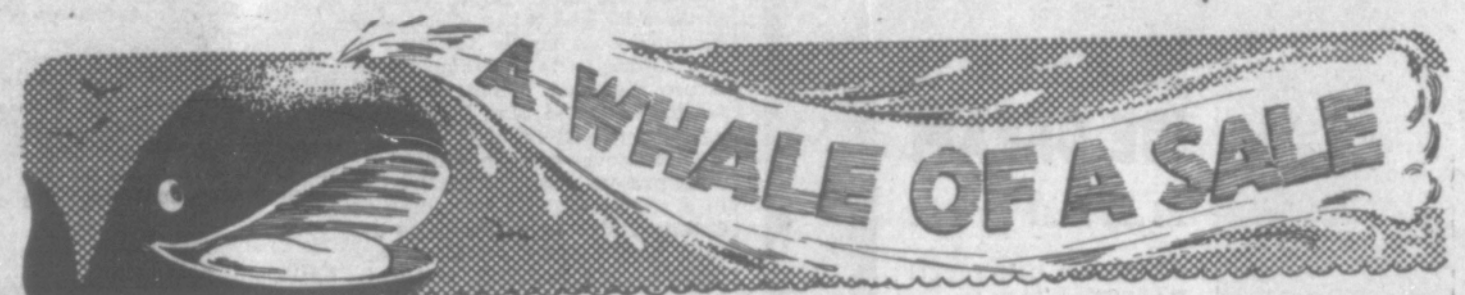
