She attended the bull-fight, so traditionally a part of the country; was present at a showing of Hamlet, which was spoken in English with Mexican captions; saw the zoo and the pyramids. She enjoyed the unusualness of the Mexican food.

On the trip home Mrs. Stauff visited in Los Angeles with relatives for several days, and in San Francisco with an old friend with whom she went to the ice follies. The trip both to and from Mexico was made by plane.
