Californian Visits Powers Lions

The regular meeting of the Powers Lions on June 28th was highlighted by a distinguished visitor from San Francisco. Mr. Kenneth Waters, dispatcher of the San Francisco Electric Railways was a guest of the club. He is an advanced amateur photographer and he made many shots of various phases of the meeting. He brought along his new combat Graflex, 4x5. The writer assisted him in setting up the extended flash reflectors, and co-operated to the extent of finding Lions President Ross for the benefit of the photographer. Mr. Waters was the guest of Lion Loren Warner and he has been visiting at the Warner home.

At the conclusion of the meeting Mr. Waters addressed the Lions

and spoke on several subjects. He proved to be an interesting speaker. Mr. Waters is also a 16mm movie fan and has some fine sound and film equipment in addition to his movie camera. When he was entering Powers he used the Powers Lions sign as identification for that film. He plans to show the films in California.

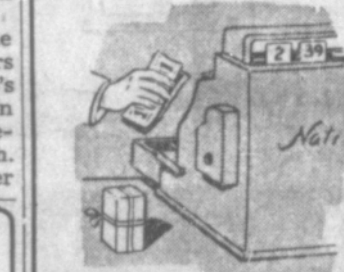
