Those attending are asked to bring a sack lunch for August 1 as the first meal at camp will be dinner that night. The last meal to be served will be breakfast on August 5.

Paraphernalia needed by both boys and girls attending includes: an apron for K. P., pajamas, sleeping bag or sheets and four blankets, a small jar of jam, jelly or pickles, bath towels, soap, toothbrush, slacks or sport clothes (dress clothes are not needed), bathing suit, and a sweater or jacket.

A small charge will be made for leather craft, but otherwise no money will be needed at the camp.

pletion to be later than expected. Approximately \$30,000 was spent in the new modern fireproof building that includes a modern chapel capable of seating 150 peo-

ple; a large foyer, family room, casket display room, two rooms for cars and storage, a music room, and others.

The chapel, family room, music room, and halls are carpeted in plain rose carpet, while the foyer has a two-tone rubber tile.

All new furnishings have been placed in the mortuary, which also includes an office and a modern large living apartment to be used by the mortician in charge.

In 1916 Charles and Henry Schroeder purchased the funeral business in Coquille, and Bandon from Arthur E. Ellingson. The Bandon chapel was managed until the disastrous fire of Sept. 1936,

at which time a \$20,000.00 loss was incurred. In recent years the services were held at the Coquille branch or in churches.

Working at the new Bandon mortuary will be Johnny Illman, graduate of the San Francisco College of Embalming, who will move his family from Seaside and will do work for both the Bandon and Gold Beach Schroeder Bros. funeral parlors.
