### Carroll's Gift and Electric—A Hometown Business

From material control supervisor of the Chrysler corporation to his own electrical contracting business in Coquille would seem to be a long and risky step to most people, but to Earl Carroll of Carroll's Gift and Electric it was a logical step and the realization of an ambition.

Earl started his business ventures with the Chrysler corporation soon after finishing school in his native city of Evansville, Indiana. His first assignment was with the Evansville branch of the automotive firm, the branch from which stems all Dodge and Plymouth cars and Plymouth trucks.

At the completion of three years' work with the Evansville plant, during which time he rose to the position of material control supervisor, Carroll was moved up a notch and transferred to the parent factory in Detroit, Michigan, where Chrysler concentrates on the cars that carry the firm name.

"It was during this period," Earl stated today, "that I first became interested in electrical work and shortly afterward, determined to make that my life work."

The Carroll electrical business might well have been started several years before it actually was born; if the war had not interfered. But Uncle Sam called and Carroll stepped into the uniform of a U. S. marine and was sent to the Marine base at San Diego, California.

Four years in the Marine corps passed quickly for the man who rose to the rank of master technical sergeant, but it was a period that brought about a great change in the life of the young electrician and was the direct result of his settling in Coquille instead of returning to his native Indiana.

It happened while Sergeant Carroll was stationed at Camp Mirmar, California, and the object of his attentions was a lovely young Oregon girl who was working for civil service at the camp. Today, that same young lady is Mrs. Earl Carroll, known to all her friends as Mary Lou.

The young couple's original plans to be married in Coquille were quite suddenly postponed when Earl's leave was cancelled and he was transferred to Lakehurst, New Jersey, to take a special course in weather observation.

At the conclusion of the term, Carroll and his classmates were sent to Cherry Point, North Carolina, to await overseas shipment. Mary Lou left for the east coast immediately, and the marriage took place in Newberg, North Carolina, in March, 1945.

Finally, the war ended, and Earl was discharged at Paris Island, South Carolina. The newly-weds returned to Oregon, and two years ago, on March 29, 1947, the Carroll Gift and Electric store was born.

Earl's ability as an electrician has been adequately displayed during that time. Such jobs as the Biegger furniture store, the Coos-Curry transportation building on Front street, KWRO, the Purkey furniture store in the Grimes building, the electrification of the high school and the new Gas company building in Gold Beach, were secured by the newcomer to Coquille.

Carroll now has two qualified electricians on his staff. William Stevens has been with the firm nearly a year and a half, and Joseph B. Yost recently joined the firm.
