On Vacation—Pearl Miller, on vacation from Farris for two weeks, is spending his time in and around Coquille and plans to do some hunting.

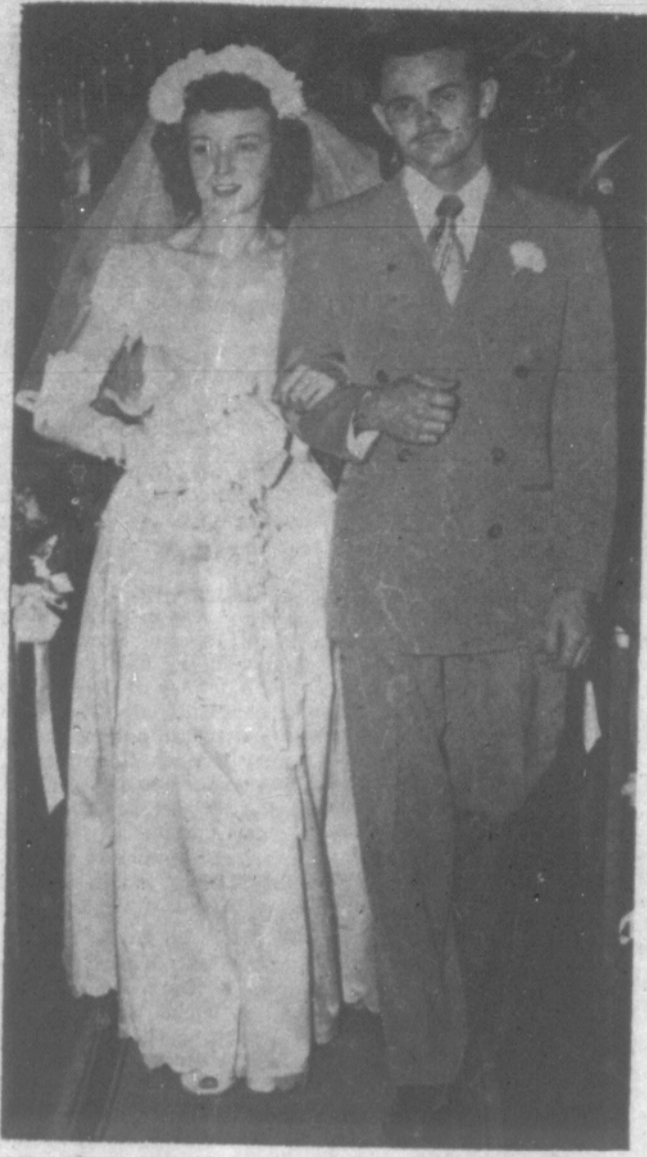
**Sew-Said Club

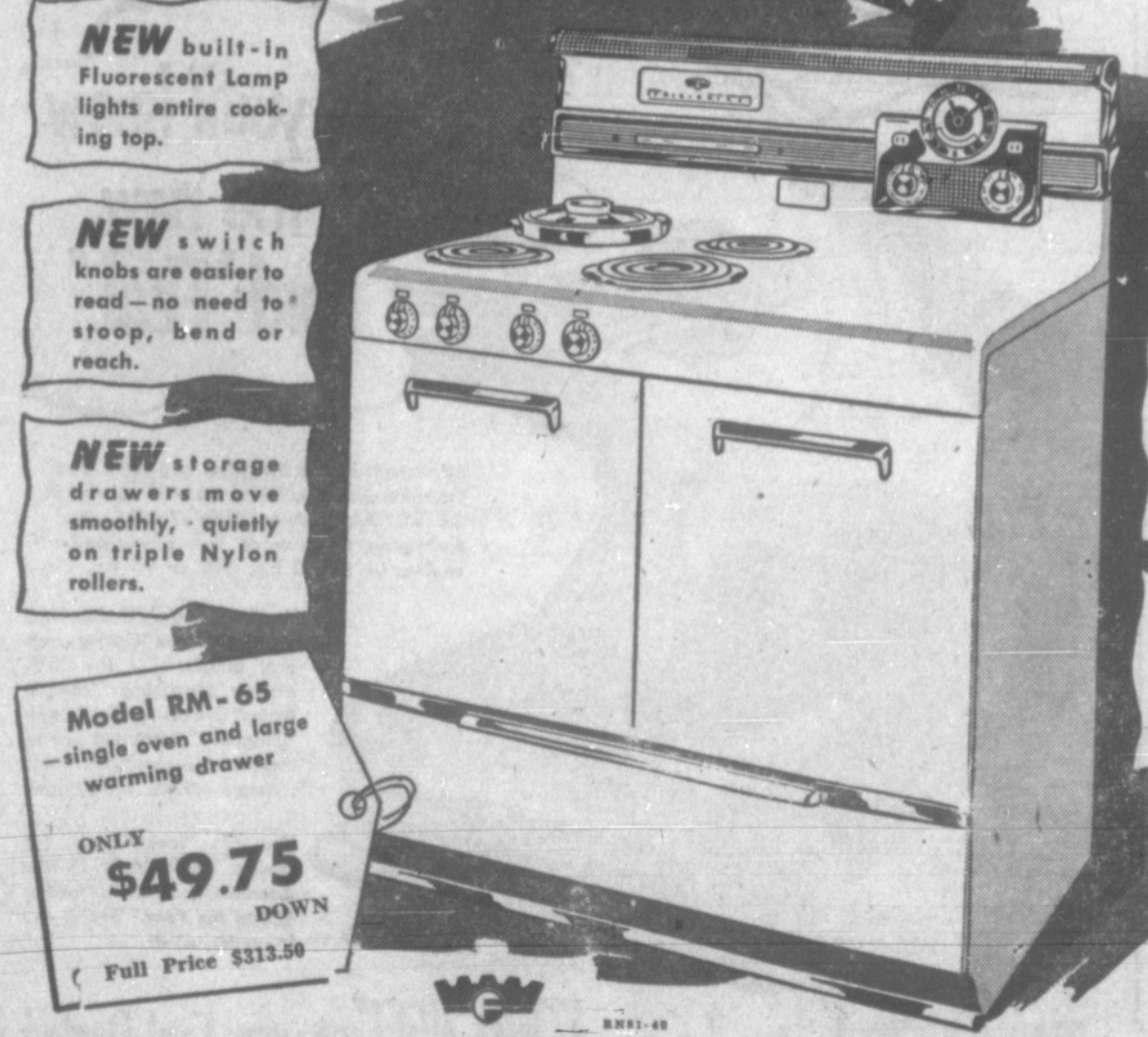

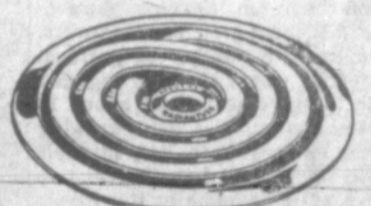
