should be one of the most interesting articles in the annual.

Class editors JoAnn Newton and Sherril Hatcher are writing the histories of the four classes.

Mae Dean Greene, art editor, has started designing the plan to be drawn on the cover of the Laurel. She will also illustrate the division pages to be placed between each section.

John Watzling, sports editor, has been compiling game statistics and schedule. He plans to run both group and individual pictures of the players in his sports section.

The stories of the organizations and activities will be written by Mary Ann Roberts and Velita Batty who have already started interviewing the leaders and advisors for each organization.

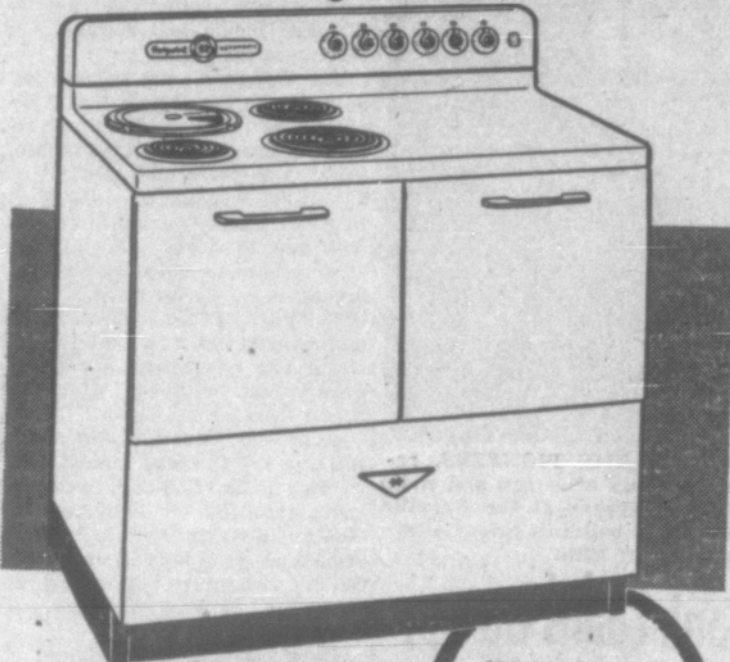

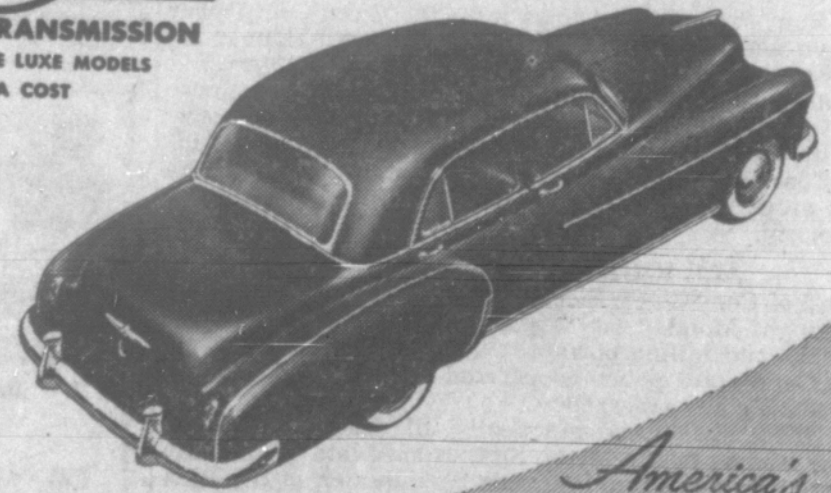
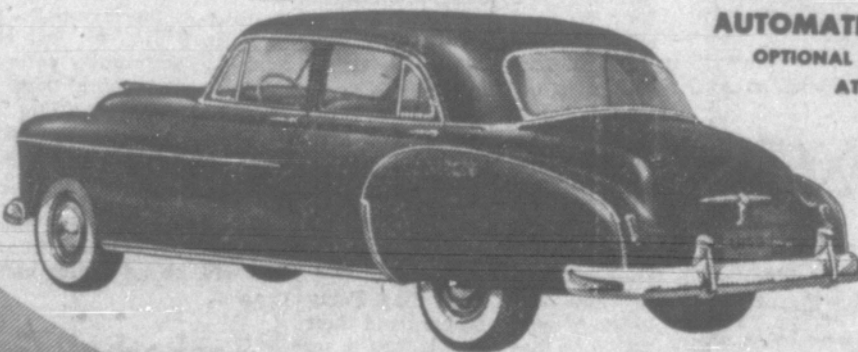
