Coquille Red Devils Defeat Bulldogs Break Tie In Overtime Period, Final 39-36

Coquille's Red Devils bounced back after their defeat at the hands of Myrtle Point Friday evening to outshoot North Bend Saturday evening, January 6th, at the Coquille high school gym and win their second Coos district cage encounter of the 1949-50 season by a score of 39-36.

Victory came to the Red Devils in the first overtime period, after the two teams had ended in a dead-heat 36-36 at the end of the regular four quarters. Coquille held the invaders scoreless during the overtime while sinking one basket and one free throw to win.

Traditionally, Coquille started slowly. The Bulldogs led at the end of the first period 10-7, and 16-12 at the half but wound up in a tie 23-23 at the end of the third quarter.

Jim Kay, Coquille guard, captured high-scoring honors for the Red Devils with 13 points, while Harold Reeves, by virtue of six free throws and three baskets, led his North Bend mates with 12.

The Green Hornets will play the Cats Saturday while the Bulldogs play the Dragons. The Tornadoes drew a bye.

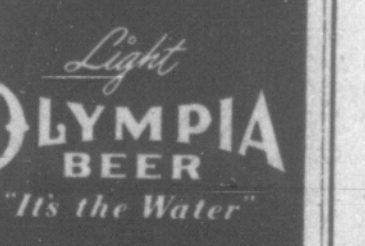

Bobcats Defeat Coquille Cagers

The Myrtle Point Bobcats pounced on the Coquille Red Devils in the first official encounter of the 1949-50 hoop season last Friday evening at the Myrtle Point gym before a near-capacity crowd. The final score was 55-39.

Zone defense seemed to be Myrtle Point's strength, and coupled with excellent "basket-weaving" by Marv Hammack, spelled defeat for Coquille.

The Bobcats moved into a commanding lead in the first quarter by counting 19 points while holding Coquille to 6. More of the same came in the second quarter when the Red Devils were held to four points against seven for Myrtle Point. Half-time score was 26-10.

The Bobcats' terrific defense faltered somewhat in the second half, and the Red Devils played them on even terms, scoring 29 points to 29 for Myrtle Point.

The difference between the two clubs was accurate shooting from the floor. Added points from foul shots gave Myrtle Point 13 out of 15, and for Coquille, 25 out of 38.

Tentative regulations for the coming year will be announced after the public hearing. The Commission will reconvene after a two week interval, make any changes deemed necessary, and set the final angling regulations for the year 1950.
