Bulldogs Annex Second Place In League; Defeat Coquille 52-37 In Hoop Final

The Coquille Red Devils dropped into a tie with Myrtle Point for third place in the Coos county cage standings when they bowed to a surprisingly strong North Bend quintet, 52-37, last Saturday night on the Bulldogs' own floor.

North Bend dominated the game throughout, leading Coquille 11-7 at the end of the first quarter, 30-20 at the intermission and 42-27 at the end of the third period.

Reeve and Wyatt, Bulldog forwards, led the North Bend attack by scoring 34 points between them. Reeve collected 19 and Wyatt tallied 15.

Coquille's scoring combination was held in check except for the first few minutes of the game when the Red Devils held a 7-5 lead, the only time Coach Schweinfurt's charges held any advantage during the evening.

North Bend bottled the visitors in the third quarter, allowing seven points while collecting twelve.

Leonard Scolari, Red Devil center, led his team-mates with 14 points on four field goals and six free throws.

Coos County Cage Tournament Starts February 17 and 18. Split Approved

The Coos county double elimination basketball tournament will get underway Friday evening, February 17th, with Coquille slated to meet the Marshfield Pirates in the North Bend gymnasium and North Bend's Bulldogs set to tangle with the Myrtle Point Bobcats on the Marshfield floor. Each game starts at 7:30. The highly controversial split issue was approved by school officials this week.

Ticket have been sent directly to the principals of each school to be distributed at their discretion. Coquille's allotment of 160 for each of the first two nights are based on a proportion of 100 adult admissions and 60 student admissions. Price are \$1.00 for adults and 50c for students with no sale of tickets at the gate available because of the limited size of the gyms.

Following the initial round of play Friday night, Saturday's games will be determined as follows: If Marshfield and North Bend are matched, the game will be played on the Pirate floor, but if the two quintets meet other opponents, North Bend will play at Marshfield and Marshfield at North Bend.

Following the Friday and Saturday night tilts, the finalists will meet February 24th and 25th at which time tickets will be sold at the gate on a first-come first-served basis. There will, at that time, be no reserved seats. However, it was pointed out today that for the first two games this week there is no point in attempting to see the game unless you have a ticket. No student body tickets or schoolmaster passes will be honored.

Junior High Cage Tourney Set Here February 22 & 23

Coos county's junior high school basketball tournament will get underway Wednesday evening, February 22nd, when the first games of the two-day meet will be played at the Coquille high school. Four games each evening will be played up for the Coos county fans with the finals slated for Thursday night, February 23.

Both "B" and "A" schools will be represented. In the initial round Wednesday Empire will meet the winner of the Bridge, Powers, Arago and Riverton circuit at 6 p. m. At 7 Bunker Hill meets the runner-up to the above winner in the "B" class.

Class "A" schools will tangle at eight o'clock when Coos Bay meets North Bend with the Myrtle Point-Coquille game set to follow.

Thursday evening, the losers of the "B" games will meet at 6 and the losers of the "A" games at 7. Winners of the "B" games tangle at eight o'clock and the championship game in the "A" class will start at 9.

Fred Adams and Leo Schweinfurt will referee the "B" games on Wednesday night and the consolation games on Thursday. Carol Salsbury and Sutphin will handle the "A" games on Wednesday and the championship game on Thursday.

Doors will be open at 5:30 each evening. Admission will be 25c for students through the junior high school and grades, 50c for high school students and 80c for adults.

Powers AC finished third by smashing the Coquille Merchants 84-57 in the consolation round.

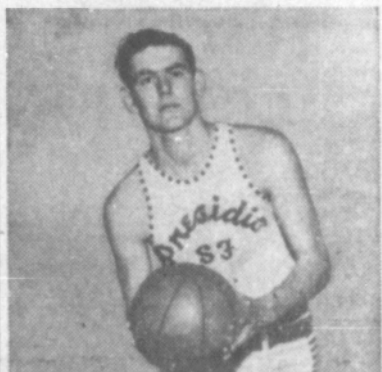
Coos Bay earned the right to meet Myrtle Point in the finals by edging the Coquille Merchants 57-54 in the preliminary round Friday night.
