Lutheran Church To Show "Two Kingdoms"

One of the greatest films yet produced in post war years will be shown by Faith Lutheran church next Sunday evening at 8:00 p. m. "The Two Kingdoms" is a full length sound film produced by the National Lutheran Council of New York, with the aid of commercial studios and professional actors. The film is filled with entertainment and factual information about displaced persons in Europe.

The story is built around a typical displaced family that were uprooted from their homeland and left with millions of others to shift for themselves. Many such persons have been rehabilitated in other countries including the U. S. The majority are still waiting for aid. These facts are placed into the story of this family and shown in this film, "The Two Kingdoms."

The National Lutheran Council has distributed this film to Lutheran churches all over the U. S. in connection with their yearly ingathering for Lutheran World Action. Since the war, the member churches of the National Lutheran Council have raised nearly thirty million dollars for this type of work.

The local Lutheran church will participate in this ingathering. There will be no admission for this film. However, a freewill offering will be received for the purpose of helping the work in Europe. The public is cordially invited to attend. The showing will be at the Labor Temple.

MORE MONEY AVAILABLE FOR LOANS TO VETERANS

Funds available to World War II veterans for G. I. loans expected to remain plentiful during 1950, according to the Veterans Administration. The VA said the American people are saving at the rate of 13 billion dollars a year, providing a ready source of loanable mortgage funds.

A number of factors, the VA said, assume that available mortgage money will go to G. I. loans and not to other purposes.

First, while the supply of loanable funds grows, the demand for investment money by business is declining. The postwar expansion boom in manufacturing plans and equipment has passed.

Secondly, yields on government and high-grade corporation bonds has declined substantially to that lending institutions have become less inclined to invest in bonds and more interested in making G. I. loans which yield a return of 4 per cent.

Two million veterans have made use of their G. I. loan privilege in purchasing homes, farms and businesses, the VA reported, and it is expected that two million more will obtain G. I. loans before the program expires July 25, 1957.

The VA emphasized that veterans should make their applications

for G. I. loans directly to a lending institution and not to the VA.

QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK
Q. My late husband, a World War II veteran, died of a non-service connected disability. Am I entitled to a pension?

A. As his widow, you may be entitled to a pension if your husband's service meets the requirements and your income does not exceed \$1,000 per year if without a minor child, or \$2,500 if with minor child or children.
