A recommendation that the Coos County Fair be operated on a standard time schedule next was voted. It went on record as favoring statehood for Hawaii and Alaska.

A resolution asking the state grange to sponsor a series of meetings in cities of Oregon to acquaint city people with the disadvantages of daylight-saving time to farmers, was unanimously voted.

A resolution from Coquille grange asking a 4-lane highway into Coquille from the Krome plant instead of a 2-lane was approved.
