Marriage licenses were granted during the week to Albert L.



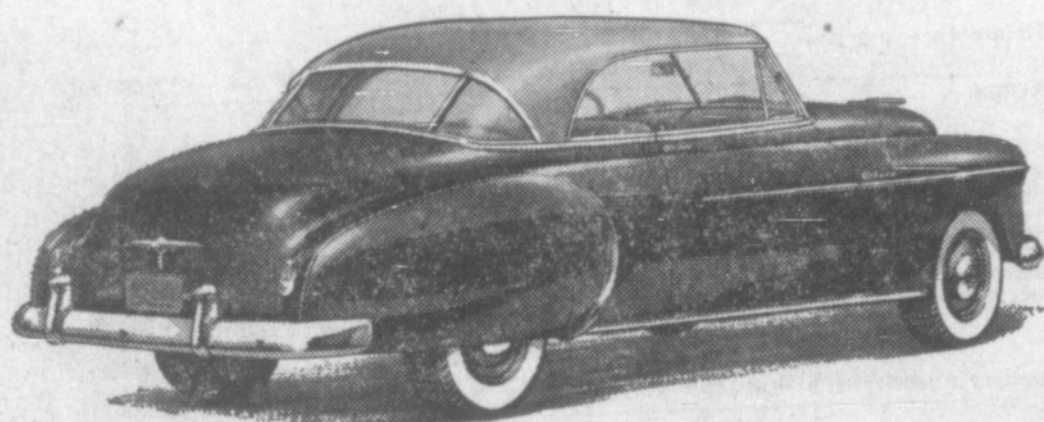
