1. Spread 1/2 cup rice on bottom of casserole
2. Lay sliced onion over the rice
3. Add layer of sliced green peppers
4. Salt
5. Cover with bite sizes of left over meat
6. Slice fresh tomatoes to cover meat, (canned tomatoes may be used instead)
7. Add another 1/2 cup of rice
8. Salt
9. Cover with liquid, which may be thin left-over gravy, vegetable juices, bullion or water
10. Bake at 350 degrees F. for 1 hr. (with a lid for the first 30 min.—remove cover, add bread crumbs, also wee pats of butter)

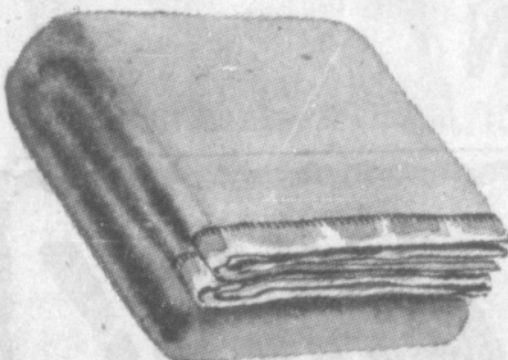
The same day, following the morning school hour, a picnic has been planned for all the students.

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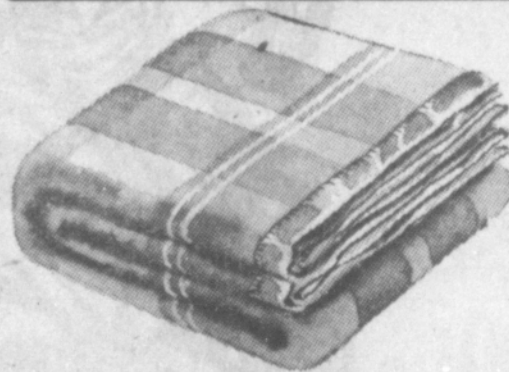
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
