Jetty Light Due For Bandon Port

Installation of a jetty light and other navigational aids on the Coquille river and port of Bandon are now being planned, Nemo Pilkington, commander of the Bandon coast guard station, said today. Operation of the light and fog signal was discontinued a year ago, but re-establishment was approved in January after a concerted local drive by Coos county civic bodies. Also slated are 15 daylight navigation marks up the Coquille river as far as Randolph. These will be covered with "scotchlite."
