The Coquille Library board has found it necessary to make two new rulings regarding the use of the city library. These rulings will become effective August 1, 1950.

1. Withdrawals from the Library will be limited to two fiction books, three non-fiction books, or three periodicals at one time. Borrowed material is to be returned

before additional material may be withdrawn.

2. Presentation of library cards will be required when material is loaned by the library.

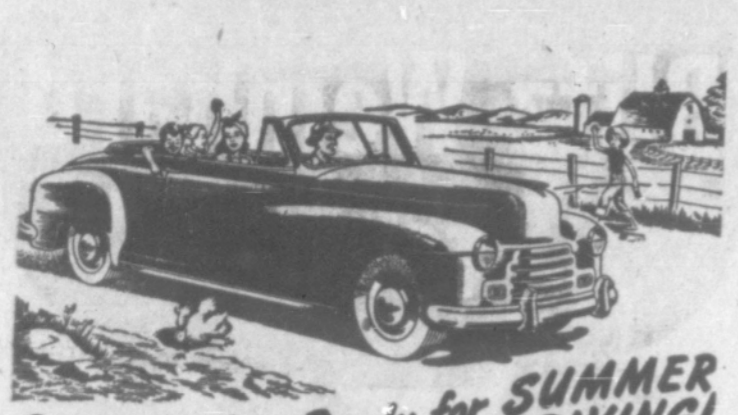

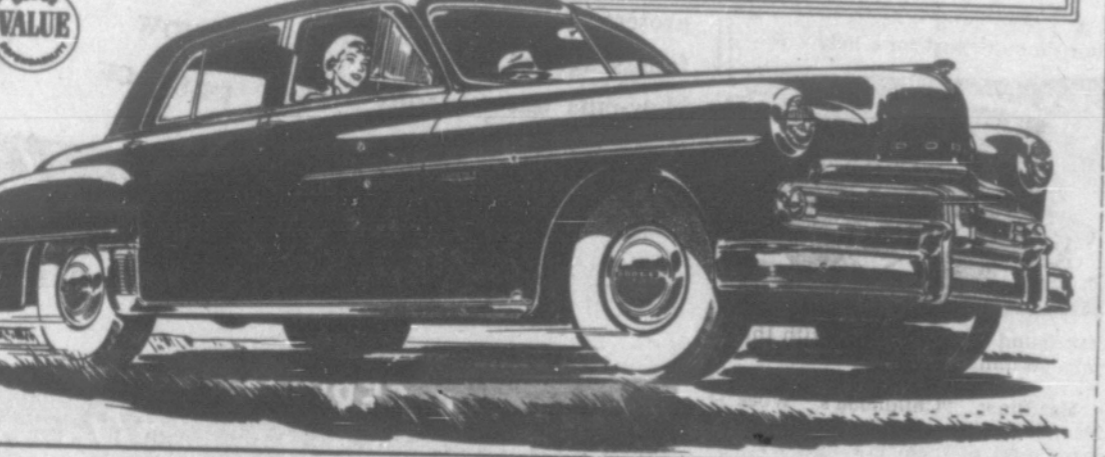
