ELKS PICNIC SET FOR SUNDAY, AUG. 20, AT NORWAY

MAN CHARGED WITH SETTING FIRES ON FOREST LAND
Ben Butts, 77, was sentenced to serve ten days in jail and pay a \$75.00 fine when he appeared in Coos Bay justice court last week on a charge of setting fires on forest land without a permit. Ivan Young, Coos Forest protective association warden, arrested Butts after about a dozen fires were set Monday, Aug. 7, on a half-mile front near Myrtle Point. Butts was burning range land.

WOOL SALE COMPLETED
Donald Farr of the Farr and Elwood store, was in Gold Beach, Brookings and Harbor last week taking delivery on 100,000 pounds of wool purchased for the Blue Mountain Hide, Wool and Fur company of Portland as the Curry county wool pool.

FOURMILE HAS FIRE
Fire covered about half-acre of land near the Fish mill at Fourmile, south of Bandon, last week, but little damage was done. The fire spread from the mill's burner. Coos Forest Protective association patrol controlled the fire.

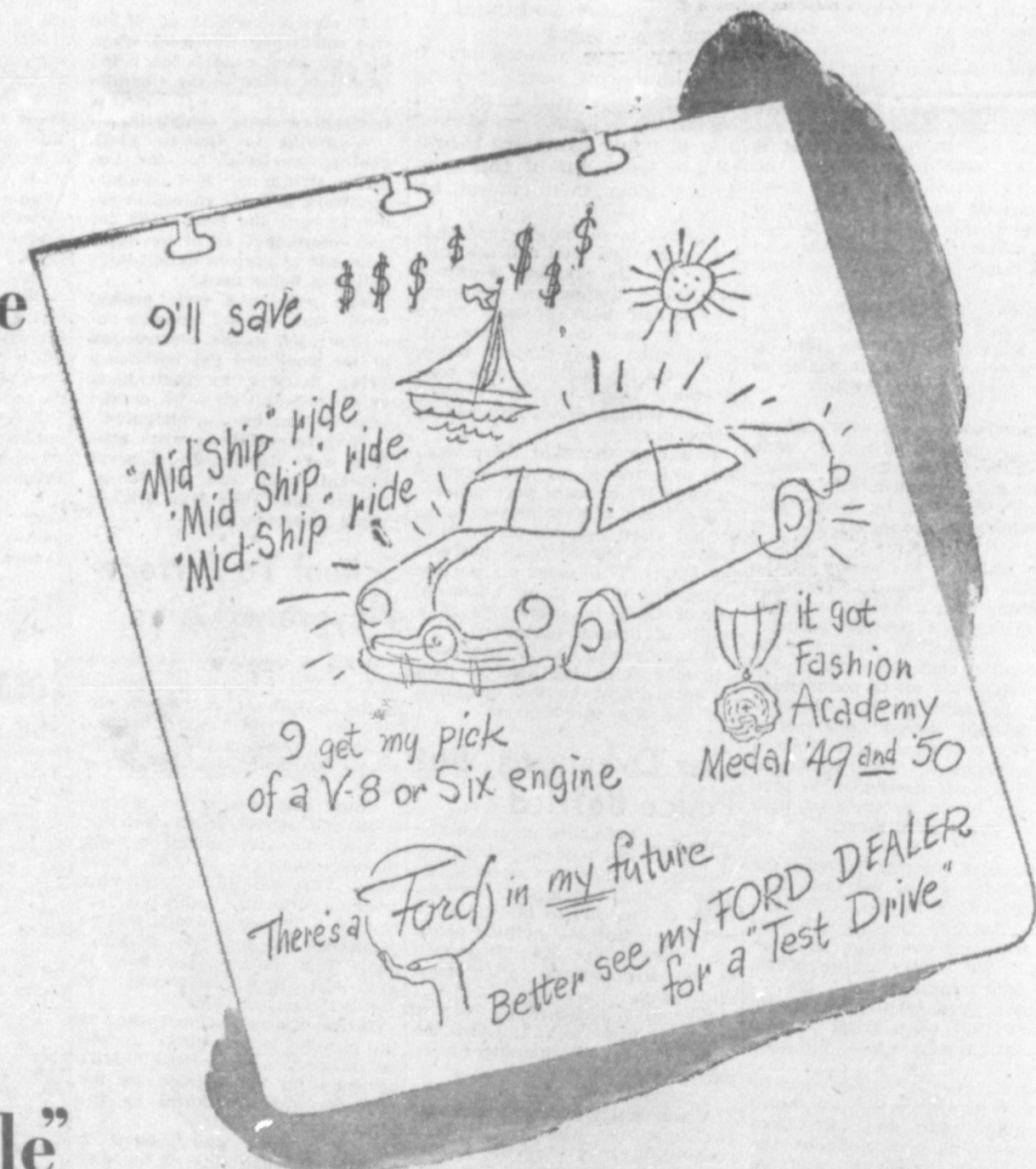
