Great State Fair Opens Labor Day

With Oregon's 85th Annual Oregon State Fair opening Labor Day, September fourth, things are shaping up for an impressive show at Salem, according to Fair Manager Leo G. Spitzbart.

More people than ever before are expected for the week long show by fair officials, and bigger exhibits are in store for them. Built around the theme of Oregon's agricultural and industrial development, the fair will provide an impressive display of Oregon's wealth.

With livestock entries now closed, it appears that 5,000 head of the state's premium livestock will be on display in the barns. Poultry and rabbit entries will close August 27th, with minor classifications closing later.

The exhibition buildings, newly painted and repaired, will be crowded with display from Oregon manufacturers. Farm machinery dealers will have larger displays than previously, as will Oregon's farm organizations.

Racing Superintendent Charles A. Evans is mulling over an overflowing list of racing entries, with a full program of the Northwest's top horses. Stall space at Lone Oak track is at a premium, with the best horses closing at Longacres and due in for the fair's racing meet.

There'll be plenty of entertainment at the fair. Free vaudeville acts are on the midway every afternoon with the Salem Municipal band playing for them. Saturday, September 9th, is Children's Day, with every ride on the midway reduced to nine cents for children under twelve.

Every evening there will be the traditional horse show and rodeo in the ring at the Stadium. Nightly in front of the grandstand will be the Winter Follies of 1950, a magnificent stage show and aquacade.

There's been no inflation at the fair, either. Gat price is stiff fifty cents per person, with children under 12 admitted free.
