### NOTICE OF PROPOSED ASSESSMENT

Notice is hereby given that on the 20th day of December, 1950, there was filed in the office of the City Recorder by the City Recorder and the Committee on Streets of the Common Council of the City of Coquille a proposed assessment for the construction of sewer and connections commencing on Henry Street between Fourth Street and Fifth Street and extending East on various blocks, lots and streets between Third Street and Tenth Street to Division Street and Carter Avenue, all in the City of Coquille, Coos County, Oregon, (commonly known as Sewer "A"). The whole cost of said improvement to the property owners and of said proposed assessment is the sum of \$38,469.17, and the boundaries of the district proposed to be assessed are as follows:
