

Coos Tree Farm Dedication Slated For July Seventh

Oregon's 100th tree farm in the Douglas fir region will be dedicated in public ceremonies to be held July 7 at Allegany, 15 miles northeast of Coos Bay.

The 205,000 acre tract, which bolsters Oregon's 2 1/2 million acre backlog of permanent timber-growing and tax-paying land, is Weyerhaeuser Timber Company's Millicoma Forest. It is the first certified tree farm in the Coos Bay region. Logging operations on the forest began a year ago in July. Logs are now being rafted from Allegany to the company's new sawmill at North Bend, which began lumber production May 1.

In announcing details of the program, Branch Manager Arthur O. Karlen points out that the July 7 dedication will follow by two weeks the June 23 tenth-anniversary rededication of the Clemons Tree Farm at Montesano, Wn. Weyerhaeuser's Clemons unit, dedicated in 1941, was the nation's first. Since then the tree growing program has been extended to over 23,000,000 privately-owned acres in 29 states.

Honor guest at the Millicoma dedication will be Dr. C. A. Schenk, eminent German forester and founder of the nation's first forestry school in 1898. An area of second-growth will be dedicated in his name. Floyd Hart, Medford, vice-chairman of the Forest Conservation committee of Pacific Northwest Forest Industries, will present the tree farm certificate to Manager Karlen. Dean Paul M. Dunn of the Oregon State College School of Forestry will act as master of ceremonies. Senate President Paul L. Patterson is expected to represent the Governor's office.

The program will include a description of the timber-growing program on the Millicoma Forest, as explained by branch Forester Royce Cornelius and his staff and Bill Gaines, woods superintendent. A tree farm tour will follow a special luncheon to be served at Allegany.

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Fined For "Slots"

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Timber Sales Set During July

Two sales of Bureau of Land Management timber will be held during July, it was announced today at Portland by James F. Doyle, Assistant Regional Administrator of the Bureau.

Twenty eight million board feet of saw timber and 2, 700 linear feet of western red cedar poles in seven tracts in the O&C area valued at \$592,521.75 will be offered at a special sale as follows: Medford district by sealed bid, 1 tract, 2, 435,000 bd. ft. on July 3; Roseburg district by oral bid, 3 tracts, 8, 015, 000 bd. ft., July 2; Salem district by oral bid, 2 tracts, 14, 900,000 bd. ft., July 2; Eugene
