Coquille Soldier's Participation In Korean Action Described

Sgt. Lloyd D. Rutherford, Coquille soldier, figured in a recent heroic bit of action on the Korean war front. The stand of his unit against a horde of Chinese Reds at the small town of Kapyong is described in Army Times, a service newspaper, as follows: "With IX Corps in Korea—As this is written, the small Korean town of Kapyong is no longer in UN hands. But for two days and two nights Company A from the 72nd Tank Bn., together with units of the 27th British Brigade, held the town against overwhelming odds, proving once again that defeat can be as heroic as victory. "The Chinese struck in all their fury at midnight. Wave after wave of communist soldiers, supporter by mortar and machine gun fire, advanced down a neutral corridor toward the town. "One tank platoon was surrounded immediately. Three tank commanders were wounded and the platoon leader was killed. Sgt. Lloyd D. Rutherford, Coquille, Oregon, assumed command and the platoon joined the rest of the company farther down the valley. The firing, dog-trotting, hordes of Chinese poured onto the company's main positions. There Lt. Kenneth W. Koch, Tacoma, Washington, company CO, ordered his men to hold. And hold they did. "Against attack after attack the greatly outnumbered group held fast. Before the tanks ran-out of ammunition the next morning, they had killed more than 800 enemy soldiers. "Finally, late the next night, as even more Red troops were brought into battle, the tankers were ordered to fall back. But the Chinese losses had been tremendous. "As one weary infantryman muttered from the back of his tank as the UN troops left the town, "They can have the piece now."

Union Pacific Filming Colored Movie On Oregon Coast Scenery This Week

Oregon's coast scenery is being filmed this week by Vincent H. Hunter, head of Union Pacific Railroad's motion picture bureau who is preparing a 16 millimeter production in color and sound, which will be given nation-wide distribution next year. Mr. Hunter, accompanied by Jack Patterson, an ace Hollywood photographer, was in the Astoria area today and will work south-

ward to the Coos Bay and Gold Beach area, visiting beaches enroute. The motion picture will probably be named "Northwest Empire" and will be a cross section of life in Oregon and Washington, including agricultural and industrial scenes as well as high-lighting the enjoyment of the Pacific Northwest as a vacation land. It will have a background of music composed especially for it. "Northwest Empire" is to be the first in a series of 30-minute motion pictures of regions of the West served by Union Pacific lines, Hunter said, and the railroad expects it to reach an audience of several million people through showings before clubs, schools and groups of all kinds.
