The local post has offered a \$25 defense bond as a prize and the winner may win as much as a \$5,000 scholarship to any college or university in the nation.

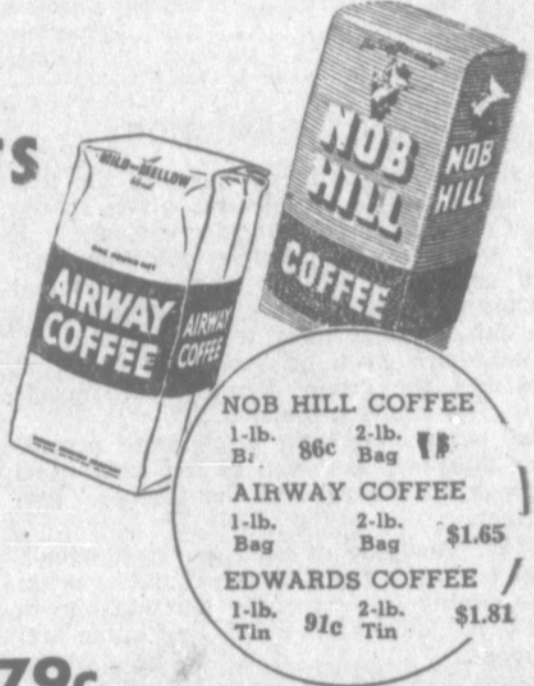

The license fee is \$2.00 for each dog owned or kept on the premises after the dog has reached the age of 8 months. Licenses are issued for the calendar year and expire on December 31st of each year. ALL DOG OWNERS are requested to pay their license fee of \$2.00 NOW to Georgianna Vaughan, Coos County Clerk.

After March 1, unpaid licenses will be considered delinquent and thereby increased to \$3.00. After that date the licenses may be paid either to the County Clerk or to an authorized dog license collector.
