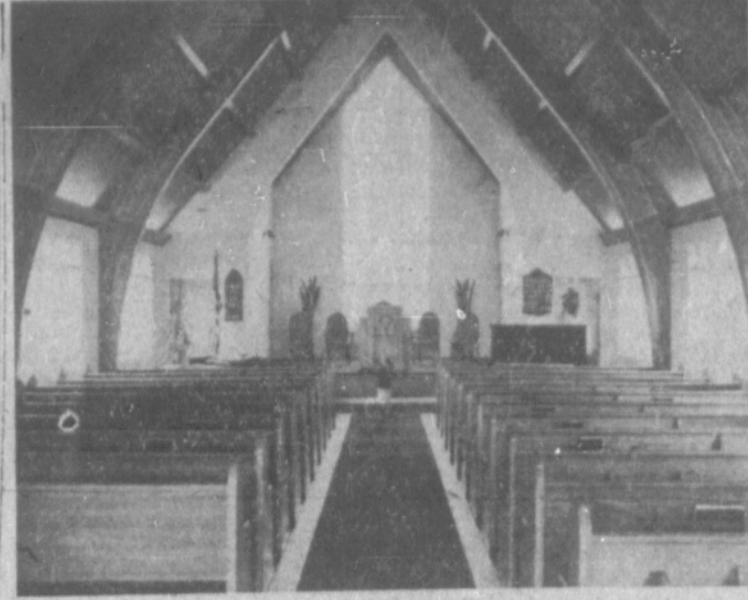

**History Related
In Coquille Area
Of Church Start**

The company of Seventh-day Adventist believers who met in the homes of members during the pioneer years of '80's and '90's of the last century were given a charter by the Oregon Seventh-day Adventist conference in 1898. The first elder in the church was D. P. Strang and Mrs. W. W. Gage served as treasurer during this period of organization when sixteen members were enrolled. Elected as elder succeeding D. P. Strang was the late C. H. Bunch who served for twenty years.

As the membership grew the need for a church building became more apparent and plans were made for the purchase of a building site. This problem was solved by Mrs. W. W. Gage who resumed her former occupation as school teacher and taught for a term in the community of Bunker Hill. The funds earned were used to purchase the site for the first local Seventh-day Adventist church which was erected and dedicated in 1903. Much of the construction work on the building was donated and the furnishings also were constructed by the members. The pulpit which was made of myrtlewood of intricate design by J. G. Fish is still in use in the Missionary Volunteer hall in the new building.

The new church which has been under construction for nearly three years has been built to meet the needs of the different organizations of the church with Missionary Volunteer hall, Dorcas supply room, mothers' room and pastor's study. The loud speaking system extends to all parts of the building.

Erected at a cost of \$45,000 the church will be dedicated Sabbath at 11 a. m., Feb. 23. Elder L. B. Biggs, president of the Oregon Seventh-Day Adventist conference will deliver the dedicatory sermon. Friday, Feb. 22nd, at 7:30 p. m. The service of consecration will be delivered by Elder J. H. Apejian.
