The solution of the problem was to call the club a general livestock club and let those members who could not obtain beef animals take some other kind of animal for a project. In other words all members in a 4-H livestock club do not necessarily have to take the same project. Poultry, beef, dairy, sheep, swine, goats and rabbits all might be included

in a livestock club.

We are still receiving many enrollment blanks in our office. There is not too much time left before county fair. All 4-H clubs planning on organizing this year should do so very soon. The earlier in the season that 4-H clubs are started, the easier it is for the members to finish their projects.

last week for New York. They were accompanied by his father, Marc Hills, who will reside there.

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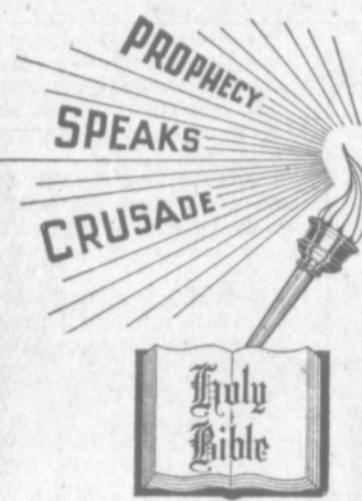

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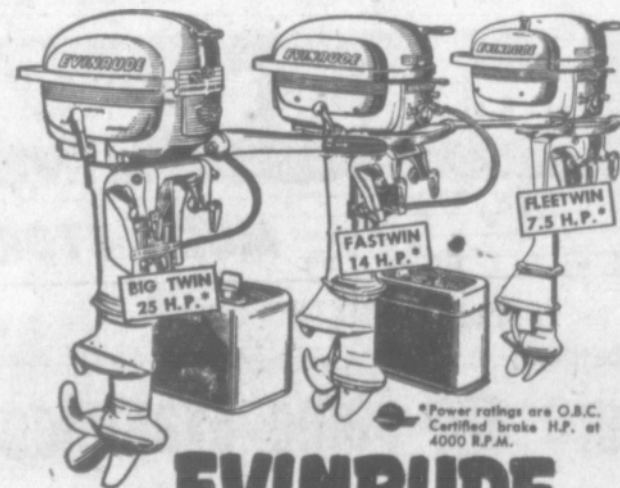

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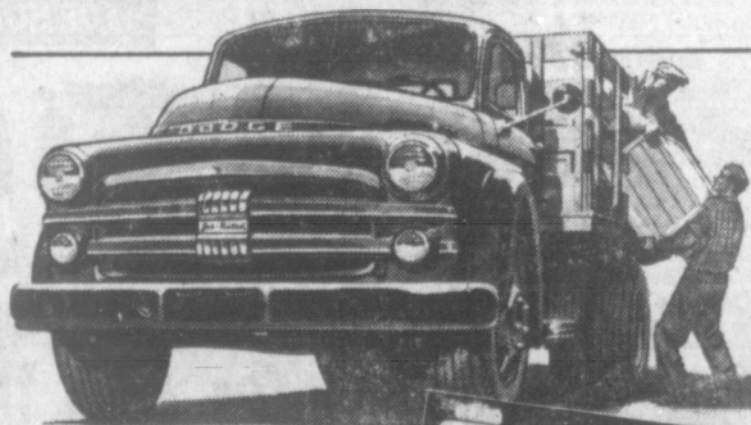
