## Ament's Ninth-Inning Single Gives Loggers 6-5 Victory Over Trotters

Dick Ament's third single of the game in the last half of the ninth inning brought in John Bilbrey and gave Coquille a 6-5 win over the famous Harlem Globetrotters at Fortier field Monday night.

Prior to this the lead had changed hands three times in a contest viewed by one of the largest crowds of the season.

Ament, the fast-improving Logger shortstop, dropped his hit into right-center with two down, Bilbrey had walked, advanced when Tom Hunt also was passed and moved to third on a wild pitch.

Fittingly Bilbrey, who represented the go-ahead run, was the winning pitcher. He had twirled four innings in relief of Skeeter Ellis.

The Trotters started with a rush in the opening frame when leadoff man Larry Cunningham doubled. He scored on a single by Davenport.

Coquille came right back with three. Chuck Humble and Ament singled and moved up on a sacrifice laid down by Dave Douglas. Don Hinchberger dropped a one-bagger into left, scoring Humble and Ament came in on an error. Another single, by Jim Newton, plated Hinchberger.

The Globetrotters made it 3-2 in the second on two walks, a sacrifice and an infield out.

They chased Ellis in the fifth. Walks and one-base hits by Davenport and Jim Wheeler accounted for two runs to put the invaders in the lead. Bilbrey was called in to quell the uprising.

Coquille knotted it in the sixth when Ament singled, went to second on a sacrifice and scored no a double into right by Lee Wert.

Singles by Roy Harrington and Bilbrey were the big factors as the Loggers moved ahead 5-4 in the seventh.

The colored crew made one last bid in the ninth and managed to push across the tying run, but some alert play by Wert and Harrington defensively broke off the rally.

Ament with 3 for 4 was the game's hitting star. Hinchberger collected 2 for 4 while Davenport was the only Trotter able to get more than one safety.

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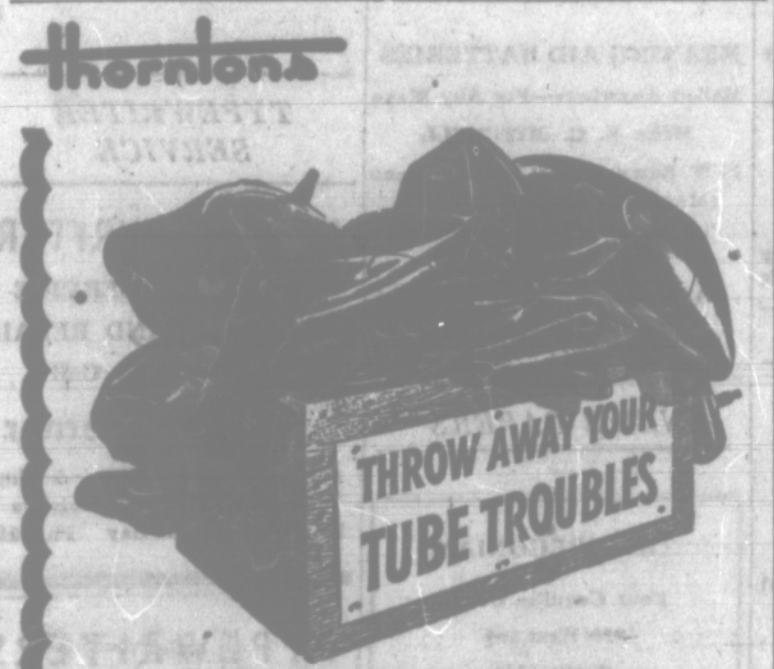
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
